It is astonishing how quickly a good stiff dog license will cause worthless dogs to fade away. Several counties in this state are preparing to raise dog licenses to \$5 per year for males and \$10 for females—in order to prevent the towns from entirely "going to the dogs." Jackson county could spare a few hundreds—or thousands—of them without setting the country back to any great extent. It pays better to raise hogs—which are better eats anyway.

A man named Connally, of Thompson creek, was arrested here several days ago, for peddling meat without a license. Our town charter makes it lawful for anyone to sell anything in town if raised or grown by themselves, but if acting as salesman for someone else, on a commission, they must pay a license. Connally being a poor man and ignorant of this law, Justice Roe very properly imposed a small fine and remitted it.

A large crowd should witness the basketball game here this Saturday evening at 8 o'clock by the H. S. teams of Canyonville and Jacksonville. Admission 15 and 25c. Come out and root for the boys. They expect it and are entitled to the hearty support of their home town people. At a recent meeting our chamber of commerce passed a resolution to this effect.

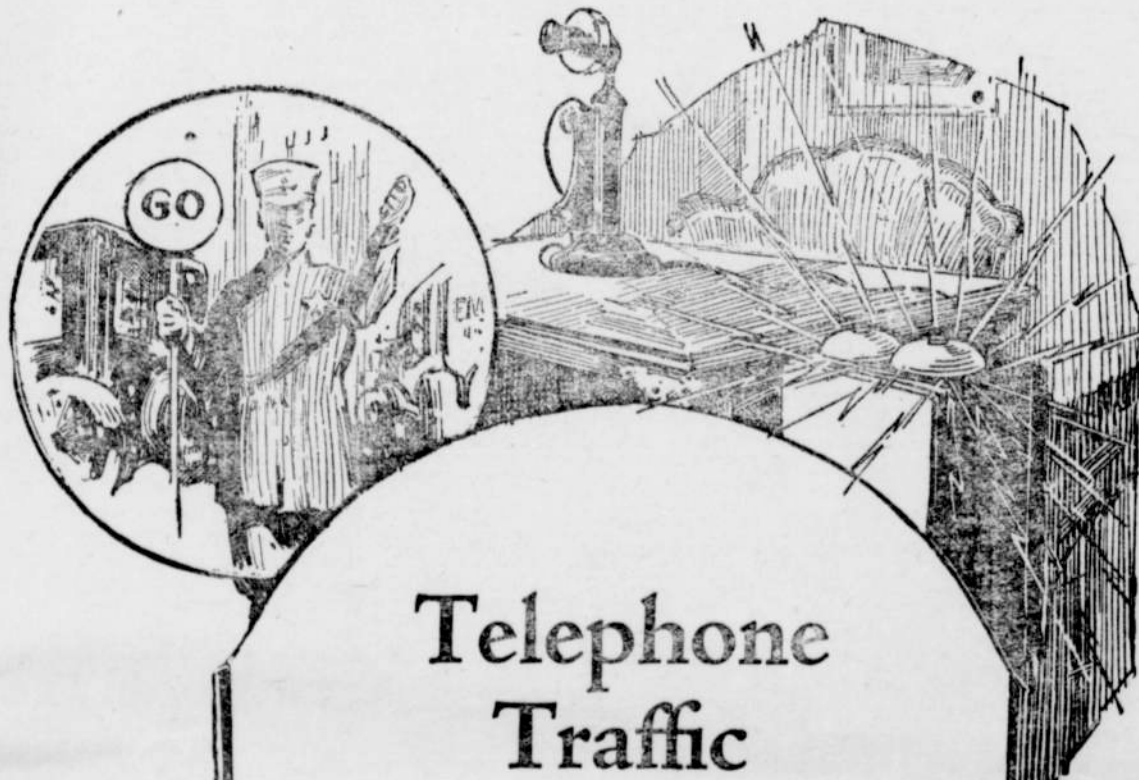
