## Petitions Asking For Paved Road

A mass meeting was held in the City hall Wednesday evening, which was attended by a large number of enthusiastic citizens, among them being several from Medford and the Ruch country. Mayor Britt acted as chairman of the meeting.

The object of the meeting was to consider the advisability of petitioning the county court to use public road funds—which are now available as a result of bonding the county some time ago for \$500,000 for use in road improvement—to pave the road from Medford to Ruch—as described in the petition.

According to the vote taken when the county was bonded, \$80,000 of this fund must be used in improving the road between Jacksonville and Ruch. It can not be used on any other road.

Considering the fact that very little of the half-million dollar fund has been used in the western part of Jackson county—most of it going for new roads through the mountains to Klamath Falls and the various summer resorts in the eastern part of the county, for the benefit of the tourist travel—it is hoped that the county court will consider favorably the petitions asking for this much-needed road improvement.

It is a well known fact that in the entire state of Oregon there is not a public highway of equal length—5 miles—that is used more than is this road between Medford and Jacksonville, and therefore the paving of this road would benefit a larger number of taxpayers than any other road in Jackson county.

Mr. Hartwell of Medford, who has had much experience in road paving, was present at the meeting and, in a most intelligent manner, explained that since the road from Medford to Ruch is already graded, rocked and graveled, the cost of paving would not exceed \$10,000 per mile.

Chairman Britt appointed a large committee to circulate the petitions, which will be presented to the county court on Wednesday of next week.

Following is the wording of the petitions:

To The Honorable County Court, Jacksonville, Oregon. Gentlemen:

We do respectfully request your Honorable Body for the paving of the road leading from Medford to Ruch, in Jackson County, Oregon.

There is at the present time, \$80,000 of Road Bonds unsold, held for the paving of the road from Jacksonville to Ruch and there are at this time provisions made for the raising of \$110,000 Market Road Funds, which money might well be spent on this road, as it has heretofore

been accepted as a Market Road Project from Medford to Jacksonville, and is a road included in the Forest Road Projects, and co-operation by State and Government can be secured.

This road improvement is requested to develop the portion of Jackson County contributory to this said road, and as a shorter route to Oregon's Marble Caves, which road when completed will make the distance traveled to said caves but forty miles from Medford, where now by way of Grants Pass, the distance is 83 miles.
