## The Proper Spirit

(Medford Record Herald)

The prospect of securing a new road to the Oregon Caves via the historic town of Jacksonville, is of more than passing importance to Medford, at this time. Also the fact that this proposed road will be doubly attractive as a tourist attraction because of Old J'ville being on the line, should make us think twice before cutting off our nose to spite our face. The interest of the whole Southern Oregon country should be the interest of Medford. It is not a question of how fast Medford can be made to grow any more than it is a question of how fast the whole Southern Oregon empire can be made to grow. Medford should not engage in enterprises which in any way are detrimental to the other sections of the country. In the near future the road will be paved to Jacksonville, then it will be paved over to the caves.

It is certainly encouraging and refreshing to hear talks and arguments like those delivered here before the county court Wednesday by Judge Watson of Ashland, Lawyer Charley Reames, W. H. Gore and Bill Gates of Medford who, in the strongest and most convincing argument, advocated the paving of the road from Medford to Ruch—and that the work begin at once at the Medford end. It is just such broad-minded boosters as these enterprising gentlemen who get behind big movements that make great cities and thriving communities. It is just such boosters and spirit that converted Southern California within a few years from a worthless desert into the richest, most productive and thickly-populated district in the United States—Los Angeles increasing in population in 25 years from a town of 20,000 to a million people. Southern Oregon is richer in natural resources and advantages than Southern California and should be forging ahead at the same rate. Paved roads will help bring about such condition.

Now that the Medford-Jacksonville-Ruch road is to be paved, watch Jacksonville come to the front with leaps and bounds. Who knows but what the county seat town may again take its place as the metropolis of Southern Oregon? When this road is paved, no doubt hundreds of people doing business in Medford will prefer to live in Jacksonville. It will be only a 6-minute auto ride between the two towns.

It will be quite a feather in Medford's cap with that city headquarters and gateway to two of the world's greatest natural attractions—Crater Lake and the Oregon Caves—one on the east, the other on the west. When this road is paved from Medford to the Caves, connecting with the Crescent City highway, many thousands of tourists will travel this scenic route every summer.

## Anaconda Buys Copper Mines Here

The American Smelting & Refining Company has disposed of additional copper mines to the Anaconda Copper Mining company. This transfer, following the sale last year of Chile copper to Anaconda, is thought to include Blue Ledge copper, 30 miles southwest of Jacksonville, which the smelting company took over from the Robert S. Towne estate last year. Anaconda is connected with the Thompson Gunn control of Gray Eagle, another large copper mine in Blue Ledge vicinity.

The automobile road surveyed through the Seiad pass of the Siskiyou range and connecting Blue Ledge with Happy Camp, where Grey Eagle is situated, will be commenced this Spring, according to present plans of District Forester Cecil of Portland and the forest officials of California, where the new construction begins.

New construction in California is to start at Seattle Bar, 26 miles from Jacksonville and 19 miles from Ruch. John Dixon, mining operator of Medford, has taken over the Spiker & Spencer copper claims on Squaw creek, two miles from Seattle Bar. A large tonnage of heavy sulphide ore is indicated on the Dixon property.

In Blue Ledge and Grey Eagle combined there is exposed by development about one million tons of iron and copper pyrite ore of smelting character.
