PAVING CONTRACTS LET

Work to Begin at Once and Rushed to Completion.

Contracts for the paving of the Medford-Ruch road, via Jacksonville, were signed Tuesday morning by the county court and Sam Schell of Oakland, the lowest bidder on both jobs. He is already here getting ready for action and has selected as a site for his large rock-crusher and store rooms for asphalt, etc., the bottom land near the foot of the cemetery hill in Jacksonville.

The bid for the Jacksonville-Ruch unit was \$78,557.50, and for the Medford-Jacksonville unit, \$78,175—a total of \$156,732.50. Since getting both contracts Schell will do the work for \$1000 less than this amount.

Curio Present By Mrs. Pelton

Horace Pelton and wife, of Sams Valley, pioneers of Jackson county, spent many years in collecting a large assortment of curios, Indian relics, old guns, flint arrows, stone cooking utensils, etc.

Recently Mr. Pelton died and Mrs. Pelton, having learned that the Jacksonville Chamber of Commerce desired to obtain a collection of such relics, notified Mayor Britt that she would be glad to turn them over to this city for exhibition purposes, if an exhibit room were prepared so that proper care could be taken of them.

Wednesday Mr. Britt and G. W. Godward drove over and brought back the collection, which for the present is on exhibition in the Godward store windows and is attracting much interest.

Later on it is the intention of the C. of C. to prepare an exhibit room in the old U. S. hotel building, where everybody will be given an opportunity to contribute to the collection.

The C. of C. takes this means of thanking Mrs. Pelton most kindly for this gift, which will stand as a pretty little monument to her enterprise and generosity.

Bursell Discusses Road Paving

Ashland Tidings.

Victor Bursell, county commissioner and candidate for nomination to succeed himself at the coming republican primaries, was in Ashland Friday from his home near Central Point.

Relative to his candidacy, Mr. Bursell stated that personally he had no ambition or desire for further political honors, but consented to become a candidate for reelection at the solicitation of many friends, and through a desire to see the road program of Jackson county completed.

In discussing the Medford-Ruch road, which the court proposes to pave, he said that the issuance of the restraining order would determine the county court's authority in the matter. He stated that so far the court has worked in harmony and all road projects have been undertaken with unanimous vote of the court.

Mr. Bursell believes that the paving of the road between Medford and Jacksonville is highly necessary and will prove economy. In this connection he said that many of those who openly opposed the construction of the Ashland-Klamath Falls highway—and which cost more than the original estimate—were now coming to realize its benefits and were among its best friends. He believes the paving of the road to the county seat will not only save the taxpayers money in precluding the construction of a new courthouse within a few years, but through other sources.

Three or four dogs were found dead in town Wednesday morning—caused by poison. Whether the poison was put out intentionally or not, is not known. Among the animals thus sent to dog heaven were those of O. C. Dorothy and Roy M. Martin.
