County Roads

To Be Improved

(Medford Mail Tribune)

Road building activity in Jackson county is now underway for the season.

The county court spent Monday in the Butte Falls district looking over the Butte Falls-Prospect road—a road residents of that section have been striving to obtain for months. It is proposed to spend \$25,000 on the project, which consists of 18 miles, six being completed. The road would make Butte Falls easier of access to Crater lake tourists, and tap a rich timber country, also the south and north forks of Rogue river, excellent fishing streams.

The county crusher started operations Monday on Bear creek near Phoenix, and for the next few weeks the road force will be busy graveling the highways and byways of the Talent and Phoenix districts. The crusher will turn out 200 yards of gravel a day. It is now equipped with a re-crusher, so none of the gravel will be over three quarters of an inch in size. The equipment was operated on the land of Sam B. Sanderfer, county prohibition officer, last summer and the produce used on the roads adjacent to this city and the county seat.

About June 1st the crusher will be moved to the Sams Valley district, and roads in that section gravelled.

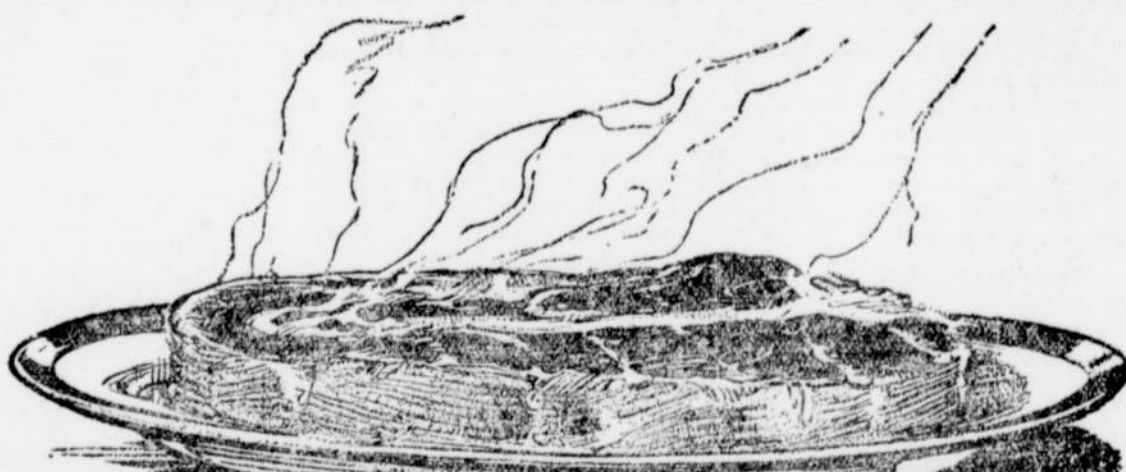
