million dollars. The new power house will more than double the capacity of the present number one plant at Copco, which has a rating of 33,500 electrical horsepower and helps serve a large part of the territory in southern Oregon and northern California.

Many Medford citizens have been figuring for years that as soon as the road was paved between there and the countyseat they would move to this place and make this their permanent home—as they know that Jacksonville is by long odds the most desirable place of residence in the county. Even if half of the Medford people move to this place who are planning upon coming it will not be long before Jacksonville will be the larger town of the two—and once more take its rightful place as the metropolis of Southern Oregon.

That alleged Ruch road injunction appears to have been lost in the shuffle. From the best information we have been able to obtain, Judge Leavitt of Klamath county has either thrown the matter out of court or taken it under advisement—probably until the road is paved and worn-out and a second paving needed—or something of that sort.
