During the past four months 40,000 pounds of prepared opium, valued at \$1,000,000, have been legally imported into San Francisco.

The petition of Messrs. F. Boerchier, R. T. Williams and A. L. Berry, of Victoria, to the provincial parliament, sets forth that it is in the interest of the public that a line of railway be constructed and operated from the city of Nanaimo, in the province of British Columbia, to some point on the north of Vancouver island; that it is their intention to apply for authority to construct, operate and maintain such railway, and that, in view of the provincial importance of the proposed railway, is opening up the rich and varied resources of the northern part of Vancouver Island, consisting of mineral, timber and agricultural lands, they ask privilege to bring in a bill to incorporate a company to construct and operate the proposed railway, with all powers, rights and privileges necessary to carry out such undertaking, notwithstanding that the time limited by the standing orders has expired. They add that they are impelled to present this petition at this late day in view of the proposed connection, at an early day, of the Island of Vancouver with the railway system of the United States, by means of a railway ferry across the Straits of Fuca, and the great importance of an early extension of railways on Vancouver Island.—*Victoria Commt.*

Only the singular, nominative case, the infinitive form of the verb, without the word "to," and the positive of adjectives, will be admitted.

Plurals and suffixes will not be admitted as separate words.
