The *Fairhaven Herald* says it is the fruit of the islands of San Juan, Lopez, Orcas, Stewart's, John's, Decatur, Blakely, Waldron and numerous others forming the Archipelago de Haro, that is going to be their great staple in the near future. The climate of the islands and the soil seem to be peculiarly adapted to fruit raising, and the manner in which apples, pears, apricots and the lesser fruits, especially strawberries, grow on those islands is simply wonderful. From the little village of Friday Harbor, on San Juan island, there were shipped last season tons of strawberries. There are hundreds of places for the most delightful summer resorts, game is plentiful, fishing the best, and the opportunity for outdoor sports remarkably good.

The amount of sturgeon caught this season in the Columbia river is said to be enormous. The fishermen have made very good wages catching them at one and one-half cents per pound. Speaking of the report that the supply of sturgeon had been exhausted, a fisherman said that the bottom of the river at the cascades, where they go to spawn, is literally covered with them. The hooks used in fishing for sturgeon are of various sizes and styles, but those without barbs are given the preference.
