## Oregon Democratic Party Chair joins gay caucus

Dick Celsi, Chairperson of the Democratic Party of Oregon, is one of only two state Democratic chairpersons who joined the Lesbian and Gay Caucus of the Democratic National Committee. The Caucus was formed February 4, 1983 and Celsi along with Minnesota Democratic Party Chair Mary Manahan joined at their first opportunity. Celsi also attended the Caucus' first meeting held July 15 in Detroit.

The Lesbian and Gay Caucus of the

Democratic National Committee was formed to enhance the role of lesbians and gay men inside the Party and to help articulate the Democratic Party's goals and commitments to the state and local level. Formation of the Caucus was co-ordinated by the National Association of Lesbian and Gay Democratic Clubs.

Tom Chorlton, Executive Director of the Association, commenting on Celsi's support for lesbian and gay civil rights said, "Dick


"Dick attended both the first and second annual Lucille Hart Dinners and we've worked together at Democratic Party conventions for passage of lesbian and gay civil rights resolu-




### A room full of lesbians
