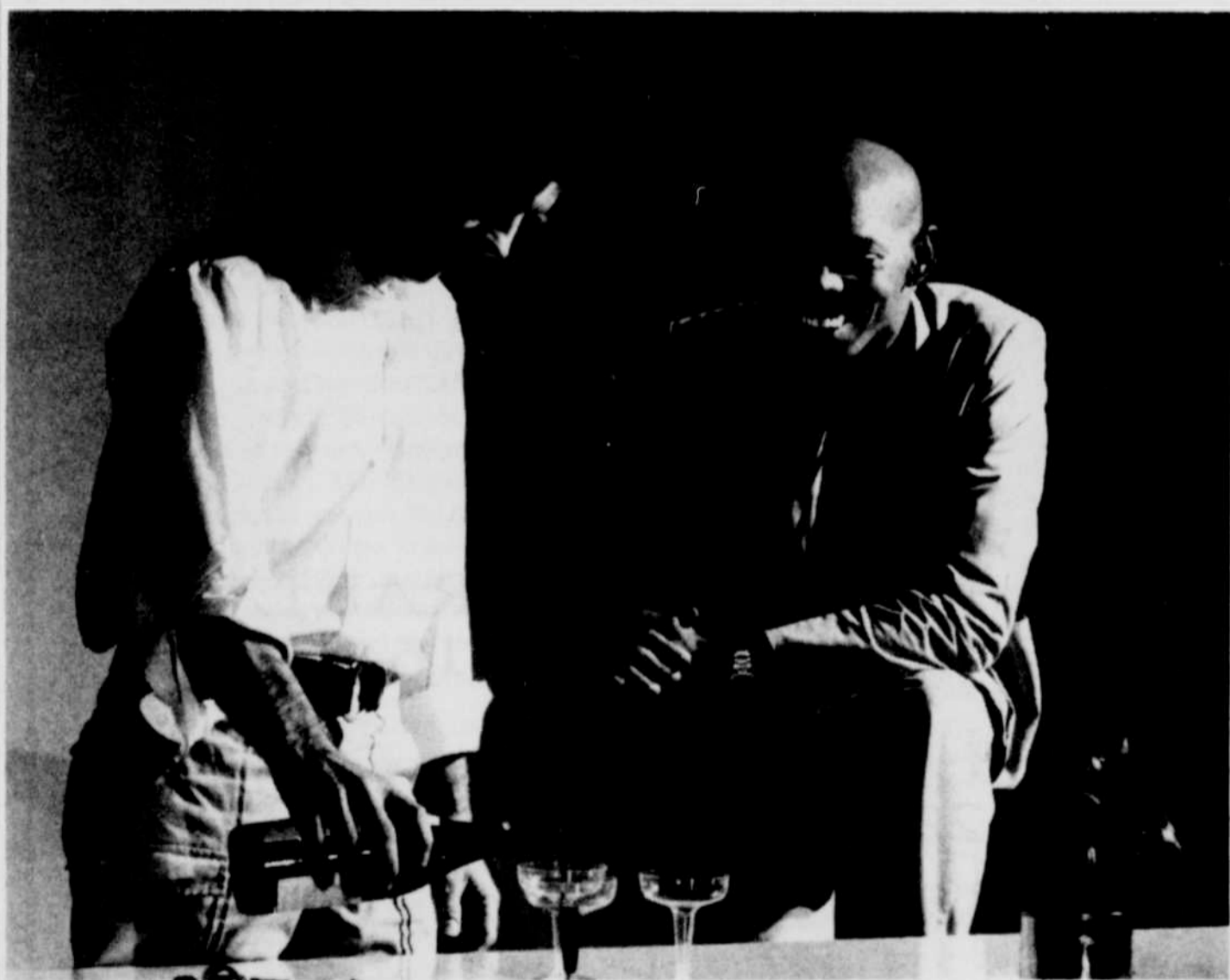
KBOO, 90.7 FM, Portland's only listener-supported, non-commercial community radio station, presents their 7th annual
