Quiet Places, a multi-media theatre production choreographed by Oregon Arts Commission 1984 Individual Artist Fellowship recipient Robin Lane, opens tonight at 8 p.m. at the **Echo Theatre**, 1515 SE 37th (near Hawthorne). The pieces — **Filling an Empty Room**, **Quiet Places**, **Origami**, **Incessant Talking**, and **Life is Art and That's No Fish Story** — explore what happens when we stop our lives to listen to the quiet only to find the noise, humor, exhilaration and surprise within the silence. A showcase of an artist's subconscious, this collection of all new material is Lane's most introspective and technically-sophisticated work.
