Marchers will assemble in the North Park Blocks (Couch and Park, NW) and begin at 12:00 noon on a route down Stark Street, ending up at Tom McCall Waterfront Park, where the rally and celebration will begin at 1:00 PM. The rally will include speakers and entertainers, as well as booths providing information, T-shirts, food, and more.

This year's speakers include Valerie Terrigno, lesbian mayor of the newly created city of West Hollywood, Califonia. Ms. Terrigno received the most votes in a field of 40 candidates and was chosen by her city council mate to be the first openly lesbian mayor of an American city.

The rally will truly be an entertainment event, with performances by the Portland Gay Men's Chorus, local folk rocker Kate Sullivan, and Romanovsky and Phillips, the accomplished musical/comedy do from San Francisco.
