Portland artists **Melinda Thornsnes** exhibits recent works at Portland Community College's North View Gallery October 2-30. The gallery is located at the PCC Sylvania Campus, 12000 SW 49th Avenue. The public is invited to view the exhibit during college business hours, and to meet the artist at a gallery reception from 7-9 p.m., Wednesday, October 2.

Tapestries created by children living in el Batram, Egypt, will be featured in an exhibition at the Oregon School of Arts and Crafts from October 10 through November 7. The exhibition opens with a reception Thursday, October 10, from 5:30-8:30 p.m.

The children, ranging in age from eight to twenty, work daily at the Atelier de la Pyramide, a workshop founded in 1965 by Dr. Amir Aly, professor of cinematography at Cairo University. Aly will be in Portland during the exhibition, and will give a gallery talk on the tapestries on October 15, at 12 noon. Also at noon, Geary Jones and David Johnson, local tapestry artists, will discuss the process of creating their collaborative pieces.

Films and Cinema 21 present **Before Stonewall**, October 17-22.

Would you believe Ronald Reagan starring in a cross-dressing musical during the war? How about a silent film whose

entire cast was said to be gay? Or the Lavender Cowboy prancing around the Wild West? From the sexual experimentation of the Roaring Twenties to the scapegoating of homosexuals during the McCarthy era, to the historic confrontation between Gays and police at the Stonewall Inn in Greenwich Village in 1969, **Before Stonewall** presents a unique, at times outrageous portrait of the history of homosexual experience in America.

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
