

Financial woes reduce important services

Roseburg's Gay and Lesbian Alliance (GALA) received no outside funding this year. And although there are volunteers to staff the 24 hour gay and lesbian helpline, and others willing to publish the monthly newsletter, Gay Ol'Times, there is very little money available to continue these services. At the July business meeting it was decided to suspend publication of the newsletter to insure the integrity of the helpline. Presently, this column is Roseburg's primary link with the outside world.

The treasurer reported that a thousand dollars is needed just to keep the switchboard operational through the rest of 1986. GALA members have developed some funding

strategies to raise that amount. Fundraisers include a barbeque at Mixed Company in July, a potluck/Dutch Auction at Cow Creek in August, a monthly coffeehouse at a member's residence and a square dance complete with caller and fiddlers for September.

AIDS task force mobilizes

Douglas County's establishment of an AIDS task force responded to the request of a young man at one of the local hospitals who thought he had AIDS. He suffered night sweats, dehydration, low-grade fevers and rapid weight loss. He came out to his family and doctor while hospitalized and was immediately isolated while his HTLV-III antibody test was being processed. It took about a week. This story, unlike many, has a happy ending. His family affirmed their love for him. And his test came back non-reactive.

Gay Republicans take stand

A handful of local gay Republicans are becoming more active and more visible as a result of Portland's Rev. Joe Lutz's primary win in Douglas County. The Baptist minister gay-baited his way to a countywide majority. His strong showing stirred strong sentiments on the gay issue. And responsible gay Republicans are coming out of the closet for the first time to address the issue.

Southern Oregon's first PWA dies

Rhone Poni, the first person diagnosed with AIDS in Southern Oregon, passed away. He returned to San Francisco last year where he remained until his death. His ashes will be returned to Southern Oregon where they'll be scattered near the creek he called home.

Faggots dance at Cow Creek

A performance of The Faun, The Elf Queen and the Woodcutter's Daughter took place at the Cow Creek Community Center, 15 miles east of rural Azalea. The performance was staged by "Those Wolf Creek People," a local theater group. A dozen faggots joined 75 Cow Creek residents at the community center, where Assunta Femia stole the last act with his presentation of the Fire Dance. It was a moving experience. And the dancing that followed included faggots dancing with faggots. Surely a first in this isolated rural community.

PWA activist visits Roseburg

Steve Politer, a PWA previously active in the San Francisco ARC/AIDS Vigil, currently active in the S.F. AIDS Foundation spent a week with the Roseburg community. He ended his visit by traveling to Portland where he marched behind our banner with about a dozen other GALA members.
