Gertrude Stein and a Companion is a portrait of the long relationship of American writer Gertrude Stein and Alice B. Toklas. Stein is perhaps better known for her relationship to the "lost generation" (her term) of writers and artists in Paris during the 1920s than for her own writings.

The work of Miriam Margolyes, as Gertrude Stein and Natasha Morgan, as Alice B. Toklas, has won consistent praise from critics in England. They are currently touring the production in the United States. Margolyes has appeared in numerous plays, films, television and radio programs. Morgan, besides acting on stage and television, runs a small theater company and is a playwright.
