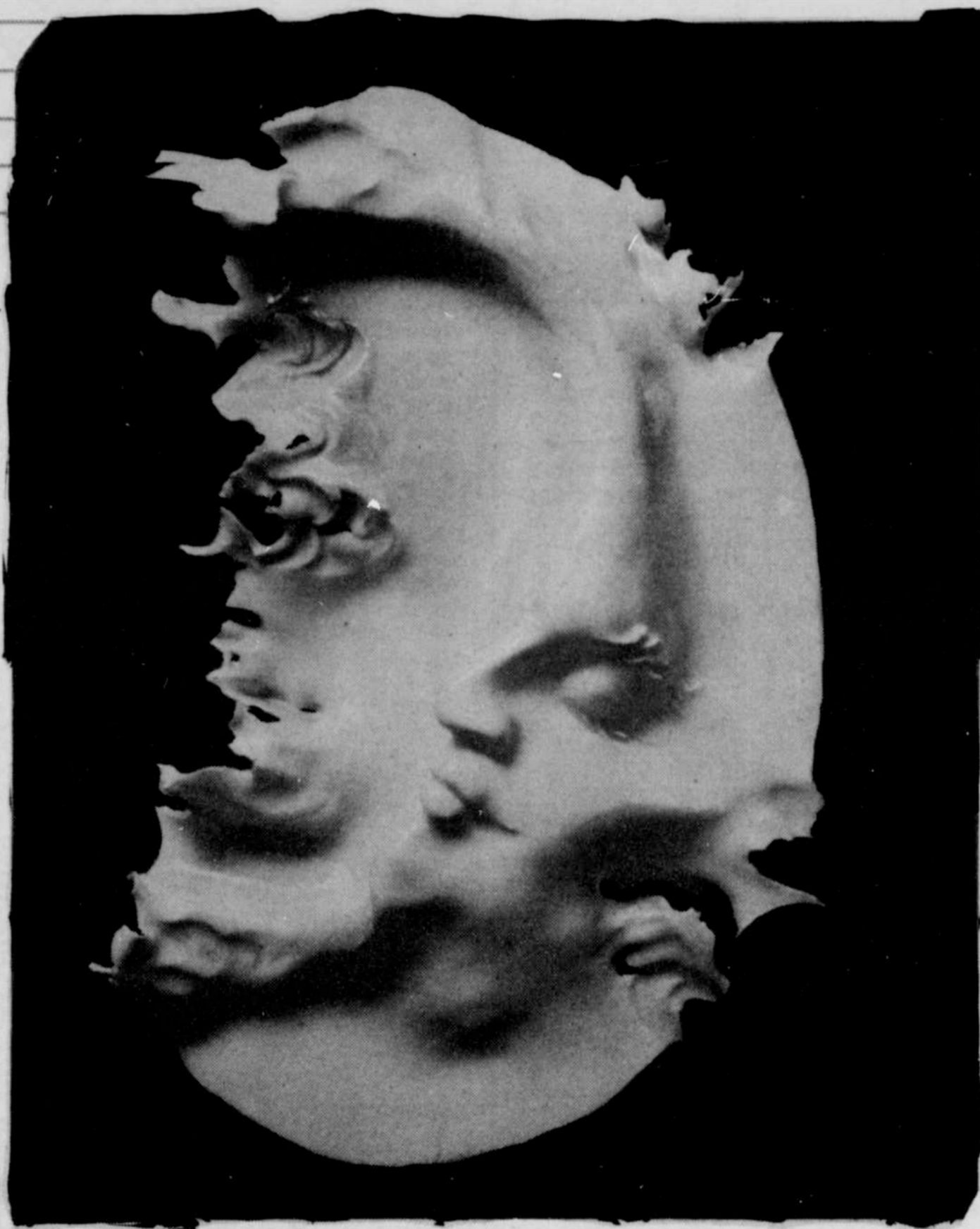
Phoenix Rising presents **Star Watch** at **Darcelle XV**, 208 SW 3rd, at 8 p.m.
