

### 1200 from all walks of life raise \$90,000

Proceeds from 10 km walk shared by CAP and five other agencies offering AIDS-related services.

ore than 1200 people — men, women and children — walked in the four quadrants of Portland on Sunday, August 9th, to raise \$90,000 for the Cascade AIDS Project's human support services for persons with AIDS and ARC, AIDS prevention programs, and the Oregon AIDS Hotline. CAP will receive 75% of the net proceeds with the remaining 25% distributed evenly between Outside In, Phoenix Rising Foundation, Oregon AIDS Task Force, Oregon Hospice Association, and CODA (Comprehensive Options for Drug Addiction).

Representatives of corporations, small businesses, neighborhood associations and sports organizations made up 155 teams and joined dozens of families and hundreds of individual walkers from all walks of life in an enthusiastic 10 kilometer trek around Portland's inner city.

"From All Walks of Life was truly a community-wide event — and I don't mean just the gay community," said Steve Talbot, walk coordinator. "It was a wonderful day. The volunteers were outstanding. We have had dozens of calls of appreciation."

Talbot says that checks are still being received and that not all pledges have been mailed in yet. People are urged to return their pledges as soon as possible. And anyone wishing to make a donation at any time may send their checks to From All Walks of Life, PO Box 14765, Portland, OR 97214.

# Portland Archdiocese site of papal protest






