Forum to assess gay/lesbian community needs

n February of this year, the United Way Board of Directors approved a new initiative, the Community Inclusiveness Project. The project focuses on the special needs of minorities and geographic service areas.

One component of the project is a forum with members of the gay and lesbian community. The purpose of the forum will be to identify and discuss community needs and issues. The information will be used as recommendations in guiding and influencing United Way funding, policies and programs. The forum results will be included in a report titled "Community Profiles Report" which will be published in January 1988 and distributed throughout the Portland-Vancouver area.

The forum with the gay/lesbian community is being cosponsored by Phoenix Rising, Lesbian Community Project, Counseling Center for Sexual Minorities, Brinker Fund, Metropolitan Community Church and Just Out.

The forum will be held Wednesday, December 9, at the Northwest Service Center, from 7 p.m. to 10 p.m. Forum participants will be divided into discussion groups. Groups will discuss needs of community, service gaps, coordination of services, and access barriers.

This forum is a beginning process to new understanding of the gay/lesbian community by United Way. It is imperative that the community come forth and assess our needs for the agency.

Gay/lesbian couples study announced

The Portland area has been chosen as the site for a study of lesbian and gay couple relationships, the problems that they encounter, and the sources of help couples might turn to during times of stress or tension within the relationship. The overall purpose of the study is to examine the help-seeking behavior of lesbian and gay couples when they are experiencing relationship problems. been in a committed lesbian or gay relationship for one or more years, are being sought. Survey questionnaires are available at a variety of places throughout the Portland area or by mail.

Submissions are being sought for an anthology about the experiences of lesbians whose sexual assault or attempted sexual assault by men was motivated by anti-lesbian sentiment.



Gay mystery anthology seeks submissions

Short stories with a mystery theme are being sought for a first-of-its-kind lesbian and gay anthology.

The work is being compiled by Michael Nava, whose book *The Little Death* was widely praised by both gay and mainstream reviewers. Nava explained that he had been surprised when he learned that no such anthology existed, so he decided to create one.

"Mysteries offer the writer a chance to develop gay or lesbian characters and themes, without having them become the main focus of the story," noted Nava. "In that sense, they represent a sort of second wave of gay writing. The first wave, in the seventies and early eighties, consisted much more of stories and books in which being gay was meant to be the main theme — coming out stories, for example, and romances."
