Gay and lesbian helpline begins operation

1-800-333-CHAT. Remember that number — it's a new, statewide lesbian and gay helpline which begins operation on July 5. The helpline will be open 16 hours a day. from 4 p.m. to 8 a.m., seven days a week. Monday through Thursday from 4-10 p.m. The helpline will provide complete disability access, as well as TDD for deaf, hearing impaired or non-speakers. (The number for Eugene residents is 683-CHAT.)

The Lavender Network, Inc. and members of the Eugene gay and lesbian community began organizing the helpline almost a year ago. Last September TLN received a grant from the Chicago Resource Center which was matched with funds raised within the community.

"We are concerned that the helpline be available and useful to members of our community - lesbians and gays in rural Oregon, minorities, gay and lesbian youth, and people with disabilities - who are not currently being served by any other organization," said Rya Philips, Helpline Coordinator.

National Lesbian Conference update

The National Lesbian Conference planning meeting to be held in Portland will occur the weekend of July 21-23, on the campus of Portland State University. Registration for the planning conference will be \$15-\$50, sliding scale; the fees include three days of meetings, workshops, networking with women from across the country and all entertainment during the weekend. On Friday, July 21, local lesbians have organized Best of the Northwest, a concert with Motherlode, Portland Lesbian Choir, and special guests Musica Femina at the Northwest Service Center (1819 NW Everett) at 8 p.m. Plans also include a dance, coffeehouse, and a reception on Sunday.


Coast bed and breakfast closes
