wants to ensure that Portland grows wisely.

Blumenauer has continually championed civil rights for sexual minorities during his 21-year career in government.

"I have had an unbroken record of supporting anti-discrimination efforts. I have probably cast more votes on this than anyone else." Not only will he be supportive, but he will lobby others in our interest.

Blumenauer was a strong and vocal advocate of the sexual minority community during the Measure 9 battle in 1992, even though he was busy campaigning for mayor.

Blumenauer has progressive ideas about family and the various shapes that families take. He is

strongly in favor of allowing couples, both gay and straight, to create domestic partnerships. "We have a situation today where people who do exactly the same work, and get exactly the same salary, end up getting much different compensation packages based on family conditions. I think the patterns we have today don't speak to how people really live."

Blumenauer does not support making wide-sweeping changes in how the city is run. "Would I design Portland like this, if I were starting over again? No. But it works. We have the potential to have the best City Council in the history of Portland."

And, despite charges to the contrary, Blumenauer does have a human side. He counts as his greatest single achievement his finishing first in his category in the 1991 New York Marathon. The category was elected officials over 40 years old, running with an arm in a cast.

It may surprise you that we don't automatically endorse candidates on the basis of their sexual orientation—though we wanted to endorse Neal for just that reason.

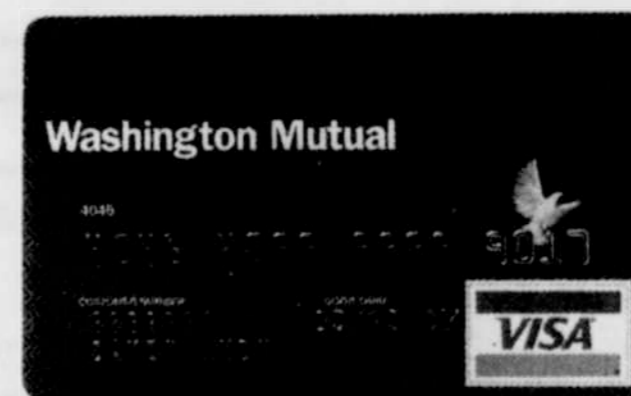
