


And now, the bad news

The OCA loses in Gresham, but scores victories elsewhere in Oregon

In Gresham, with all but the absentee ballots counted, the OCA's measure had received 7,188 yes votes to 7,108 no votes. But according to the PHOTO BY CATHERINE STAUFFER

McRobert described the OCA's effort in Gresham as a "stealth campaign," noting that the people who gathered signatures for the initiative were brought in from Salem and Wilsonville, and that only one of the city's 66 churches had contributed money to the anti-gay-rights campaign fund.

Gresham voters defeated Measure 9 in 1992, and Tuesday's effort marked the first time OCA members had tried to get one of their local initiatives passed in a city where Measure 9 was voted down.

Gresham Mayor Gussie McRobert said, Thursday, May 19. it was too early to celebrate the results of the Gresham vote.

The mayor said she did not know how many absentee ballots remained to be counted Thursday. The Multnomah County Elections Division said about 7,000 total absentee ballots were returned, but it was undetermined by press time how many of those were sent in by Gresham residents.

Isewhere in Oregon, four local OCA initiatives were approved. In Roseburg, an antigay-rights measure drew 2,410 yes votes to 1,317 no votes. In Oakridge, a local measure drew 362 yes votes to 344 no votes. In Cottage Grove, 1,083 people

gay-rights campaign fund.

23 Oregon communities. The local initiatives bar cities from enacting anti-discrimination protections for sexual minorities. They also forbid cities from spending public money in ways that serve to "promote homosexuality."

A state law that went into effect in August 1993 prohibits local discriminatory laws. And, in about half of the 23 cities where the "Son of Nine" measures have passed, city officials have vowed not to enforce them.
