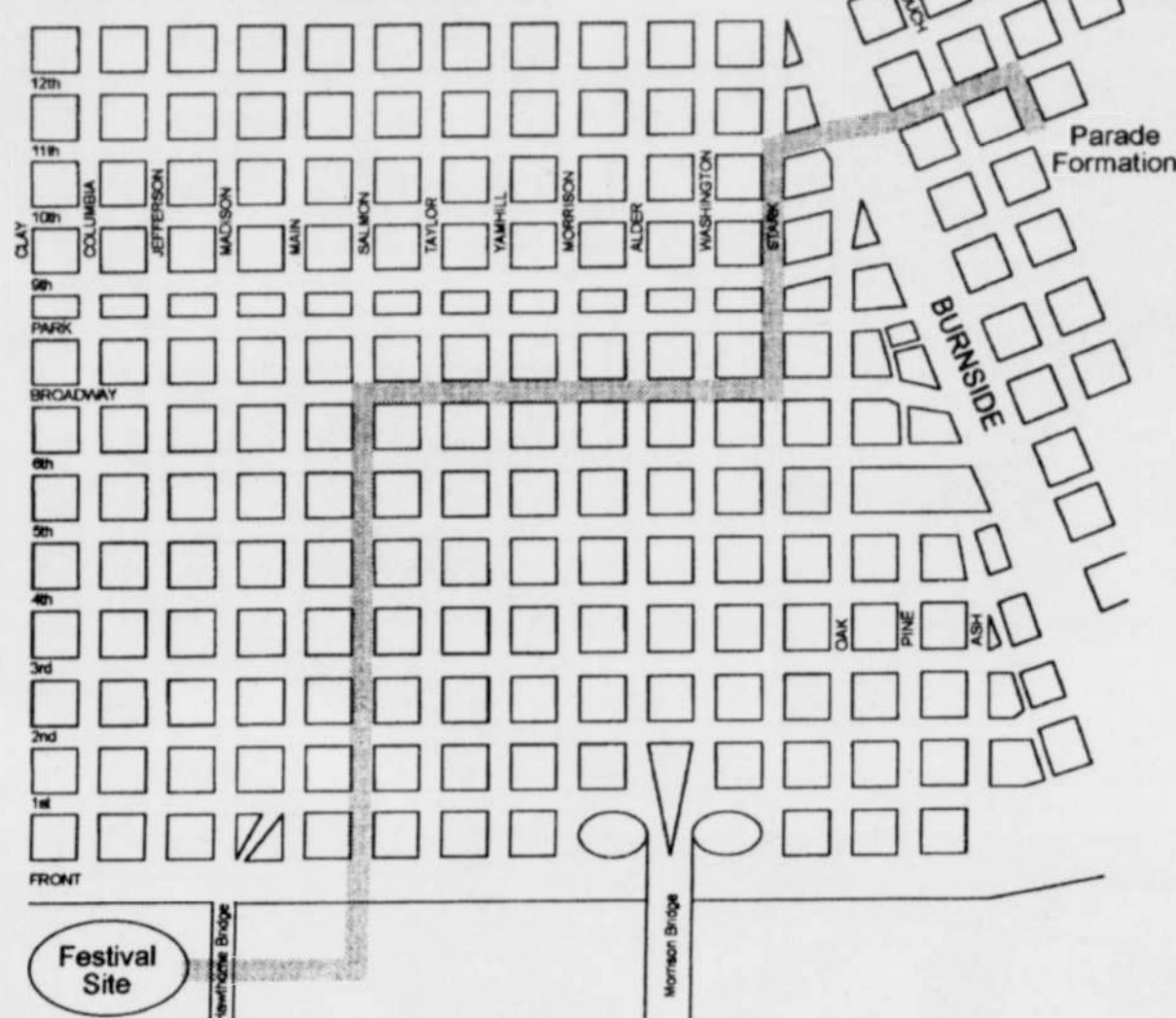

Pride Northwest kicks off Pride weekend with a Luau and Dance Party from 5 pm to 11:30 pm at Waterfront Park, Southwest Front Avenue and Columbia Street, in Portland. The luau is free and will feature live entertainment, followed by a dance party DJ'd by Mel Shapiro. Hawaiian-style food, beverages and beer will be available for purchase. All ages welcome.

JUNE 17—The First Unitarian Church in Portland hosts a service designed to provide a spiritual focus for sexual minorities and their supporters. The Rev. Roy A. Cole, pastor of Portland's Metropolitan Community Church, will deliver the sermon. The service, which is wheelchair accessible and will be interpreted for the hearing impaired, runs from 9 to 10 am. The church is located at the corner of Southwest 12th Avenue and Salmon Street.

The 20th Annual Lesbian and Gay Pride Parade, Rally and Festival kicks off at 11 am at the North Park Blocks in Portland. Pride Northwest, the sponsor of the event, asks parade participants to arrive *at least an hour earlier*. The grand marshals for the parade are Bruce Amsbary of Bend's Beyond The Closet, a group that promotes diversity and understanding via community events, and LaVerne Lewis, executive director of the Lesbian Community Project, which provides services to Oregon's lesbian community. The parade route winds through downtown Portland and ends with a rally and festival at Waterfront Park, Southwest Front Avenue at Columbia Street. An estimated 15,000 are expected to attend the rally.

From the North Park Blocks head up Davis to 11th, turn left on 11th to Stark, left on Stark to SW Broadway, right on Broadway to SW Salmon, left on Salmon across Front to Waterfront Park, right at Waterfront Park to Hawthorne Bowl, just south of the Hawthorne Bridge. Parade route is approximately 1.75 miles.

Open to those 21 and older.

A women's Pride Celebration Dance will be held at 9 pm at the Melody Ballroom, 615 SE Alder St., in Portland. DJ Mel Shapiro will spin the tunes. Tickets are \$8 in advance at It's My Pleasure; Turntable Mary's, 126 SW Stark St.; and East Avenue Tavern, 727 E Burnside St.; \$10 at the door. A raffle will be held to benefit local women's shelters. For more information call 227-1889.

A Queer Pride Dance Party, dubbed "Jizz," will be held at LaLuna, 215 SE Ninth Ave., from 10 pm to 5 am. Tickets are \$10 in advance at Jelly Bean, 731 SW 10th Ave. in Portland, \$12 at the door. Open to those 21 and older until 2:30 am, then open to all.
