



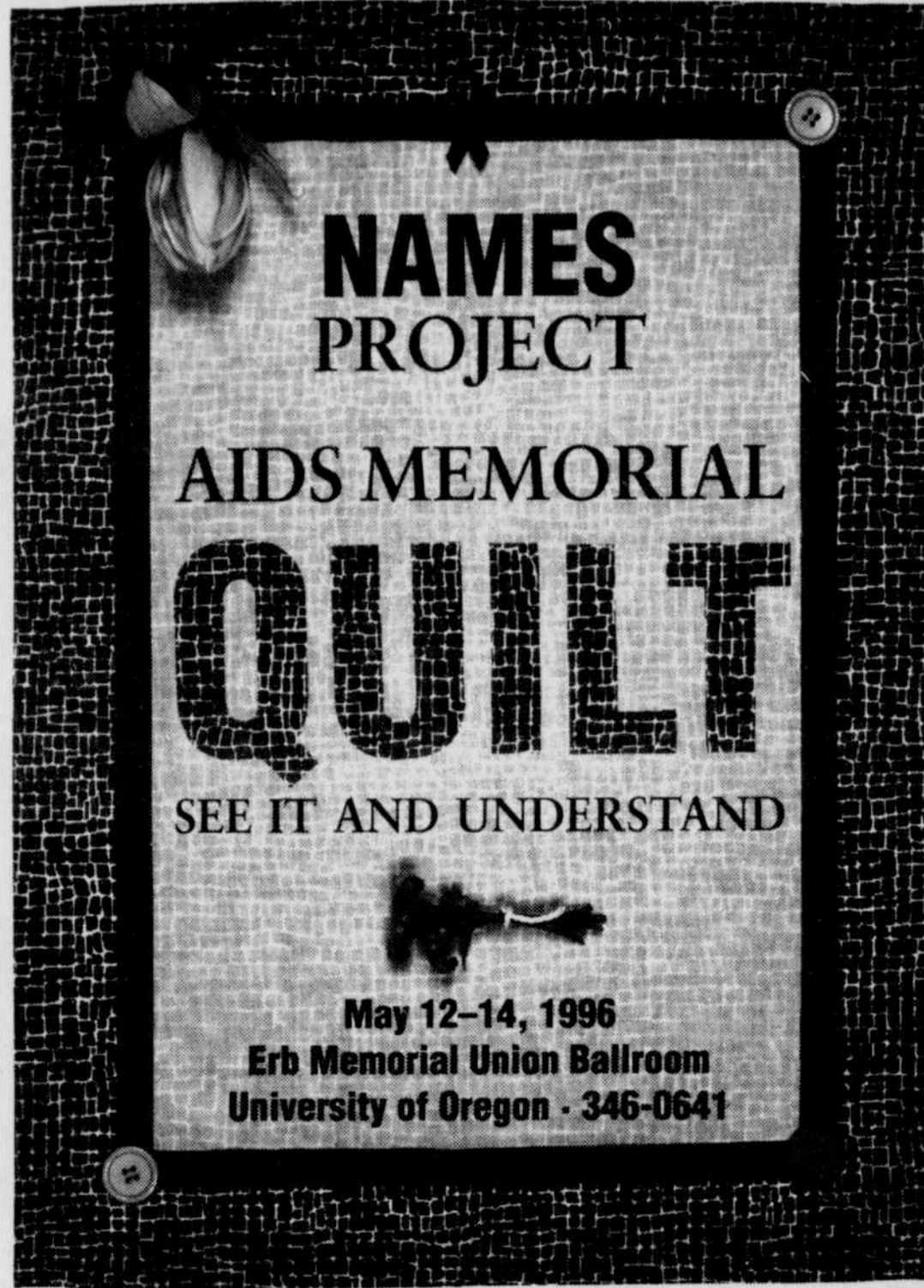

To be considered for RTP PAC's endorsement, candidates must respond to our questionnaire on four bottom-line issues:

1. Civil rights for lesbians, gay men and bisexuals;
2. Equal rights for women;
3. Reproductive choice;
4. HIV/AIDS funding, education and non-discrimination.

Endorsement interviews and subsequent recommendations are made by RTP PAC's Political Affairs Committee, made up of Board members and community activists. Eugene-area recommendations are made by a local advisory committee. The Board of Directors makes all final decisions. In many cases where no endorsement was made, candidates did not return a completed questionnaire or did not meet RTP's bottom-line criteria.
