Measure 23: Requires jury trial if more than \$750 in controversy, versus current \$200—Yes
Measure 24: Requires equal portion of signatures from each district for initiatives—No
Measure 25: Requires 3/5 majority to pass revenue-increasing legislation—No

Measure 26-41: Keeps libraries open—Yes

23 AMENDS CONSTITUTION: INCREASES MINIMUM VALUE IN CONTROVERSY REQUIRED TO OBTAIN JURY TRIAL
 RESULT OF "YES" VOTE: "Yes" vote would require that over \$750 be in controversy to obtain jury trial.
 RESULT OF "NO" VOTE: "No" vote maintains requirement that

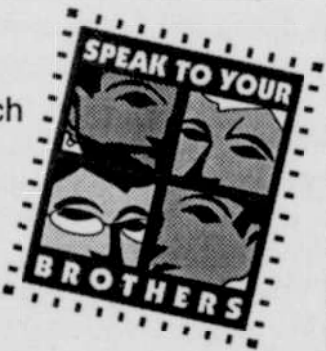
24 AMENDS CONSTITUTION: INITIATIVE PETITION SIGNATURES MUST BE COLLECTED FROM EACH CONGRESSIONAL DISTRICT
 RESULT OF "YES" VOTE: "Yes" vote requires specified portion of necessary initiative petition signatures collected from each congressional district.
 RESULT OF "NO" VOTE: "No" vote retains system not requiring collection of signatures from each

25 AMENDS CONSTITUTION: REQUIRES 3/5 MAJORITY IN LEGISLATURE TO PASS REVENUE-RAISING BILLS
 RESULT OF "YES" VOTE: "Yes" vote requires 3/5 majority of the legislature to pass bills for raising revenue.
 RESULT OF "NO" VOTE: "No" vote requires a majority of the legislature to pass bills for raising revenue.

26-41 RENEW THREE YEAR SERIAL LEVY TO KEEP PUBLIC LIBRARIES OPEN
 QUESTION: Shall Multnomah County operate libraries, levy 40.34 cents per \$1,000 value outside tax base for three years beginning 1996-97?
 ANSWER: Yes. Levy renewal keeps the Central and all branch libraries open, and expanded services: repair and other library materials; purchase of outdated and damaged materials, including story hours and other programs, with attention to help for students, and other sub programs for adults, seniors, and other sub programs at Central and other libraries.
