


More than \$97,000 was granted to 21 organizations throughout the state. The grantees include the Portland-based Multicultural HIV/AIDS Alliance of Oregon, which received \$6,000 to support its work in advocating for a "competent, culturally appropriate HIV prevention and service delivery system within Oregon."

Baker County People for Human Dignity received \$2,200 for its public education and organizing events addressing racism, sexism, anti-Semitism and homophobia in northeastern Oregon.

Josephine County Human Rights Alliance in Grants Pass got \$3,000 for a weeklong event, "Celebration of Diversity," and the Scappoose-



based Rural Organizing Project was granted \$8,000 to bolster its organizing campaign on economic literacy, which is based on the premise and a new model of educating people so that all women and men can see their inherent connectedness" is sponsoring upcoming events that may be of particular interest to the queer community.

The group will hold a class on July 10 entitled "Ending the Oppression Cycle." A class called "Men and Homophobia," which is specifically for men, is slated for Sept. 11.

The organization also offers workshops to groups, agencies, churches or schools on an array of human dignity issues including honoring diversity, grieving and healing, and building livable communities.
