Just Out has endorsed Jack Roberts for Commissioner of the Bureau of Labor and Industries—the same Jack Roberts who, as BOLI commissioner, testified to Oregon legislators last year to urge removal of transsexuals from Oregon's law prohibiting discrimination on the basis of disability.

Contrast Roberts' despicable behavior to that of his opponent for the position, Rep. Mike Fahey. Fahey took an active role in the struggle to preserve our civil rights and proved himself a friend to Oregon transsexuals by applying pressure to BOLI to investigate our complaints of discrimination.

There is no excuse for Just Out's endorsement of these enemies of transsexuals. None.
