**Want to nominate someone for a Spirit of Pride award?
The deadline looms** by Pat Young

"It's important to the community to say thank you," notes Norm Costa, who serves on the board of Pride Northwest, the group that organizes Portland's annual pride celebration. "If we don't acknowledge our own who make change, who is going to do it?"

Pride Northwest does just that with its Spirit of Pride awards, which recognize individuals or organizations for their outstanding contributions within the lesbian, gay, bisexual and trans communities.

The board is seeking nominations from the community for this year's awards, which are slated to be presented during the pride festivities in June.

Considerations for the award include community visibility, years of voluntary ser-

vice and leadership within the community.

Pride Northwest launched the Spirit of Pride awards in 1993—the year after the volatile Measure 9 campaign, a divisive ballot-initiative struggle over gay and lesbian rights.

Despite its loss at the ballot box, Measure 9's sponsor, the Oregon Citizens Alliance, was back on track with Measure 13, a watered-down version of Measure 9 that was poised for the November 1994 ballot. During that period, the OCA was also successfully promoting "Son of 9" measures in smaller cities and towns throughout Oregon.

Many observers say the anti-gay ballot
