Ursel and Sierra Briano through Dec. 24.

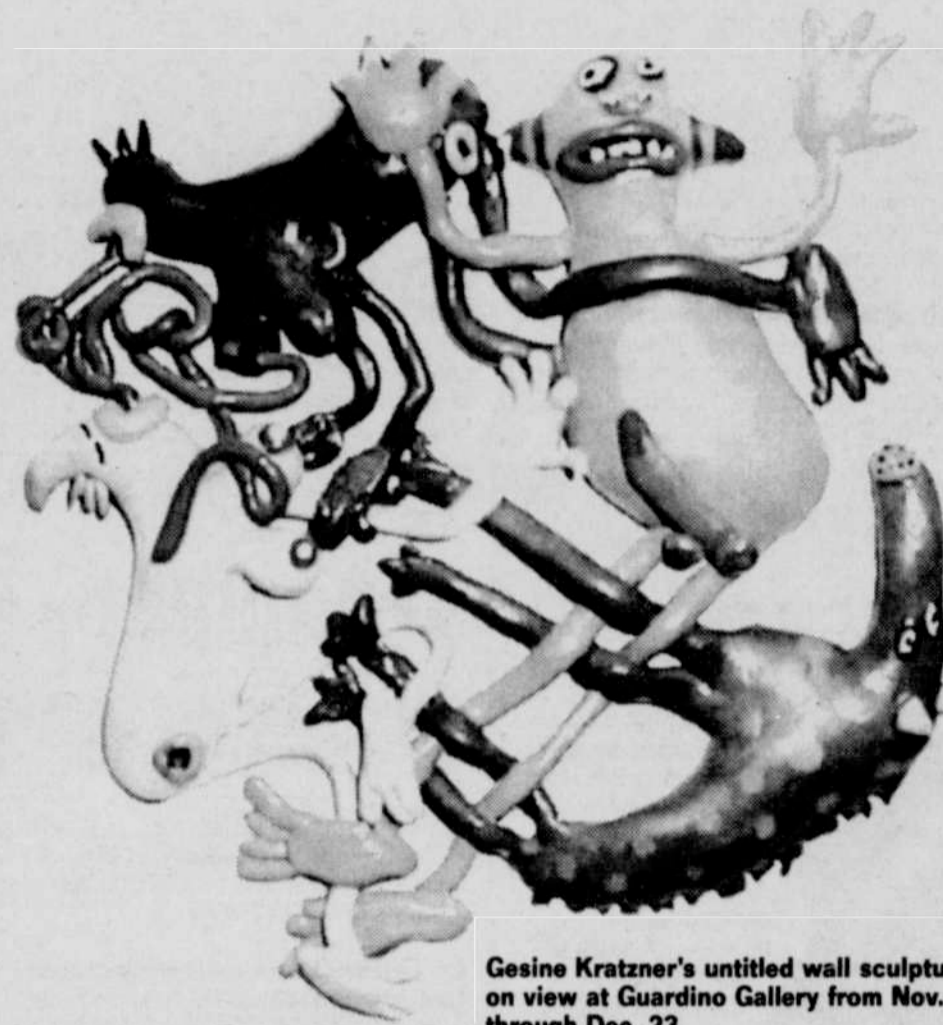
