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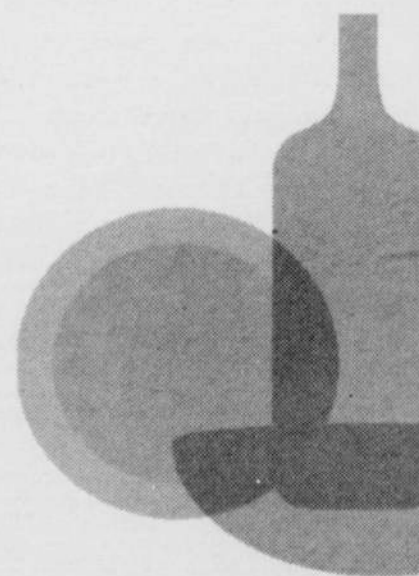

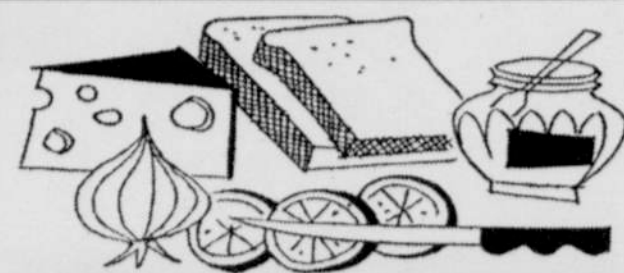

After-party appetite?

It's 12:30 a.m., you've been drinking and dancing the night away—and it's Tuesday. Suddenly nachos or a Grand Slam breakfast becomes culinary genius. The hunger that accompanies a late night of partying is equivalent to beer goggles for your mouth. And if you know anything about late-night eateries in P-town, you're bound to head to the popular spots. But you could be tired of the zany crowd at The Roxy, or the scrutiny of the guards at The Hotcake House, or maybe you're just fed up with the wait at The Montage...yeah, me neither. But if you're on the lookout for a late-night bite a little less in the spotlight, here are three to quench that queer hunger:

Cassidy's • 1338 S.W. Washington St.

With a late-night happy hour from 10 p.m. till 2 a.m., everything is either \$5 or \$10. We're talking 5 big ones for Dungeness crab cakes with chard and chipotle aioli. I mean, aioli—where do you see that at 1 a.m.? And if you're ravenous and feeling rich, go ahead and shell out 10 bones for that braised lamb shank with port and cider reduction on linguine. Even the \$5 vegetarian quesadilla was enormous, chock full o' spinach and peppers. The grilled chicken sandwich came out hot on a grilled ciabatta and towering with thin-cut fries. Hell, I'd eat here sober, and the classy mahogany atmosphere is a sight for cigarette-sore eyes. Tucked in under a beacon of neon by I-405, and just a block from Stark, this is truly a hidden gem.

Dot's Café • 2515 S.E. Clinton St.

Serving mock-Mexican food and hearty American classics till 2 a.m. every day, Dot's is one-of-a-kind. 1970s furniture and your grandma's tableware are amusing, but the flocked paisley wallpaper and oil paintings of sad clowns and Colonel Sanders are downright entertaining. Other than a truckload of vegetarian options (and a handful of vegan options), the food is a sideshow to the experience of Dot's Café. If you haven't been, then you haven't seen all of Portland. This place could be considered a hangout landmark. You'll know when you go. A side note: Being a nonsmoker, I felt I had secondhand smoked two packs of cigarettes in an hour.

Holman's • 15 S.E. 28th Ave.

Open 24 hours on Friday and Saturday and till 2 a.m. all other nights, Holman's is the standard for graveyard shift grubbin'. An entire page devoted to burgers and sandwiches can heal any after-hours appetite. The Monte Cristo came out triple-decker style and dripping with cheese and maple syrup. The chicken Cobb salad was titanic, and although not an iceberg fan, I sank my teeth into the tender grilled chicken, crispy bacon, hard-boiled egg and fresh tomato slices with gusto. Perhaps after a late Saturday night, you could keep your eyes peeled for the 10 a.m. Bloody Mary Bar on Sundays, where you can immaculately conceive your own blessed beverage. **JN**
