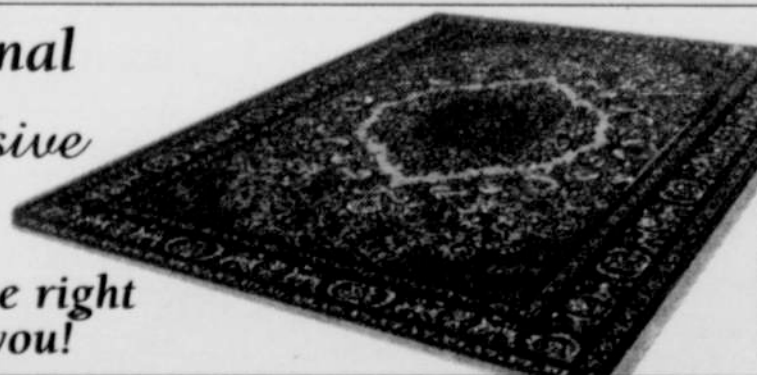

After the fellowship wraps up, Hopper says, he would like to land a job with NPR. Most importantly, he hopes the fellowship will help define the direction his career takes.

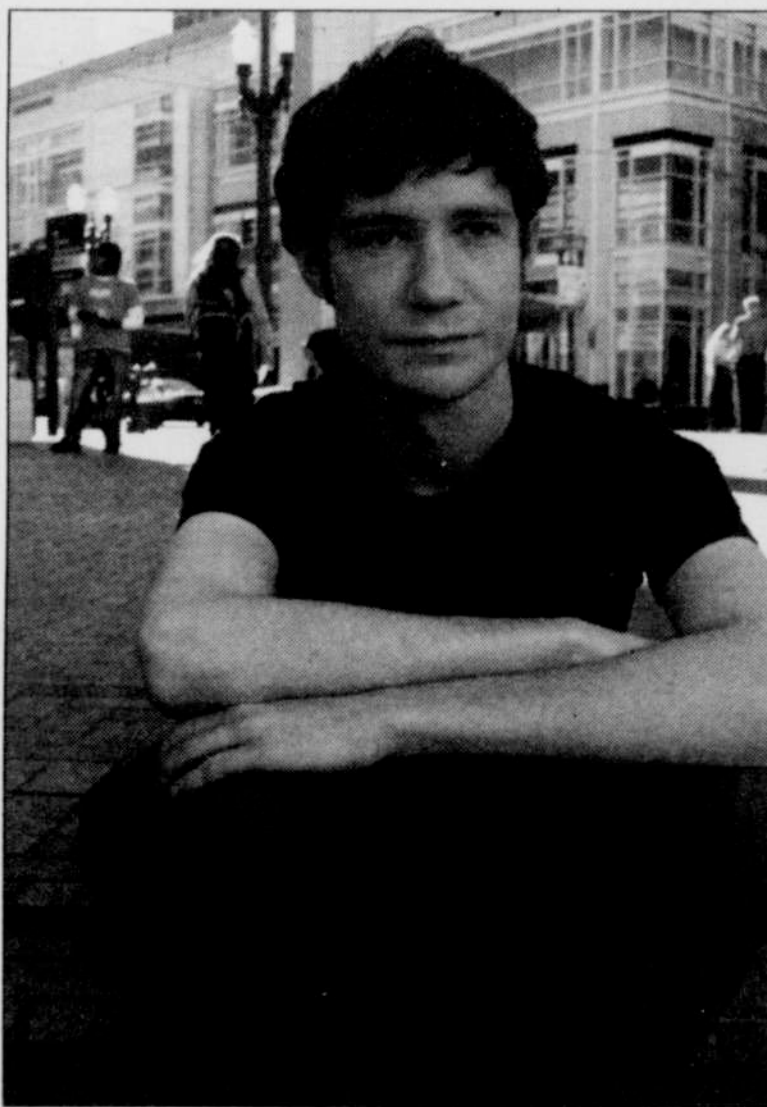

ROP TO HOLD WALK FOR TRUTH, JUSTICE AND COMMUNITY

In the wake of Measure 36 and the Oregon Supreme Court's recent decision to invalidate the more than 3,000 marriages performed in Oregon last year—along with a host of other injustices to working people, immigrants and communities in Oregon and around the

along party lines, by one vote. In a show of bipartisanship, the House overwhelmingly passed a similar version in February. Democratic Gov. Christine Gregoire had pledged to sign the bill.

"Although Equal Rights Washington is disappointed in today's vote since Washington voters overwhelmingly favor ensuring equal rights for all, thanks to the Human Right Campaign's unprecedented efforts, we now have a lasting statewide organization that will make the difference in years to come," said George Cheung, executive director of Equal Rights Washington, the state's queer advocacy group.
