A Host of Stars for Camp Starlight

With a name like Divas & Desserts, it's got to be delicious. A variety of celestial objects will gather to perform for a stargazing crowd March 4 at Darcelle XV Showplace. While the audience treats its tastebuds and genuflects to glamour, its ticket money will help make life a little better for children affected by HIV/AIDS, thanks to this annual benefit for Camp Starlight.

Camp Starlight is a program of Cascade AIDS Project that takes children on a weeklong expedition to the Oregon Coast each August for a spiritual experience that includes arts and crafts, canoeing, swimming, nature walks and a sleep-out under the stars. "It's a place where they can come together with other children who might otherwise be afraid to disclose, in rural surroundings, to let their hair down and just be kids," says Roma Peyser, community and donations specialist with CAP.

The camp operates with a one-to-one ratio of CAP volunteers and children: about 65 of each per year. "A lot of our volunteer counselors have been coming for summer after summer, and it's a diverse group," says Peyser. "We usually have one or two counselors over the age of 65 to take the role of a grandparent figure."

The theme of this year's diva-licious cabaret in support of the camp is "Celebrity Lookalikes," according to longtime volunteer and planning commission member Kevin Cook, also known as the fabulous Poison Waters. "Several years ago, I brought in the concept of having a dessert buffet, to add a little sweetness to the event," says Cook, involved now for seven of the camp's nine years. Desserts from a wide assortment of Portland eateries will be

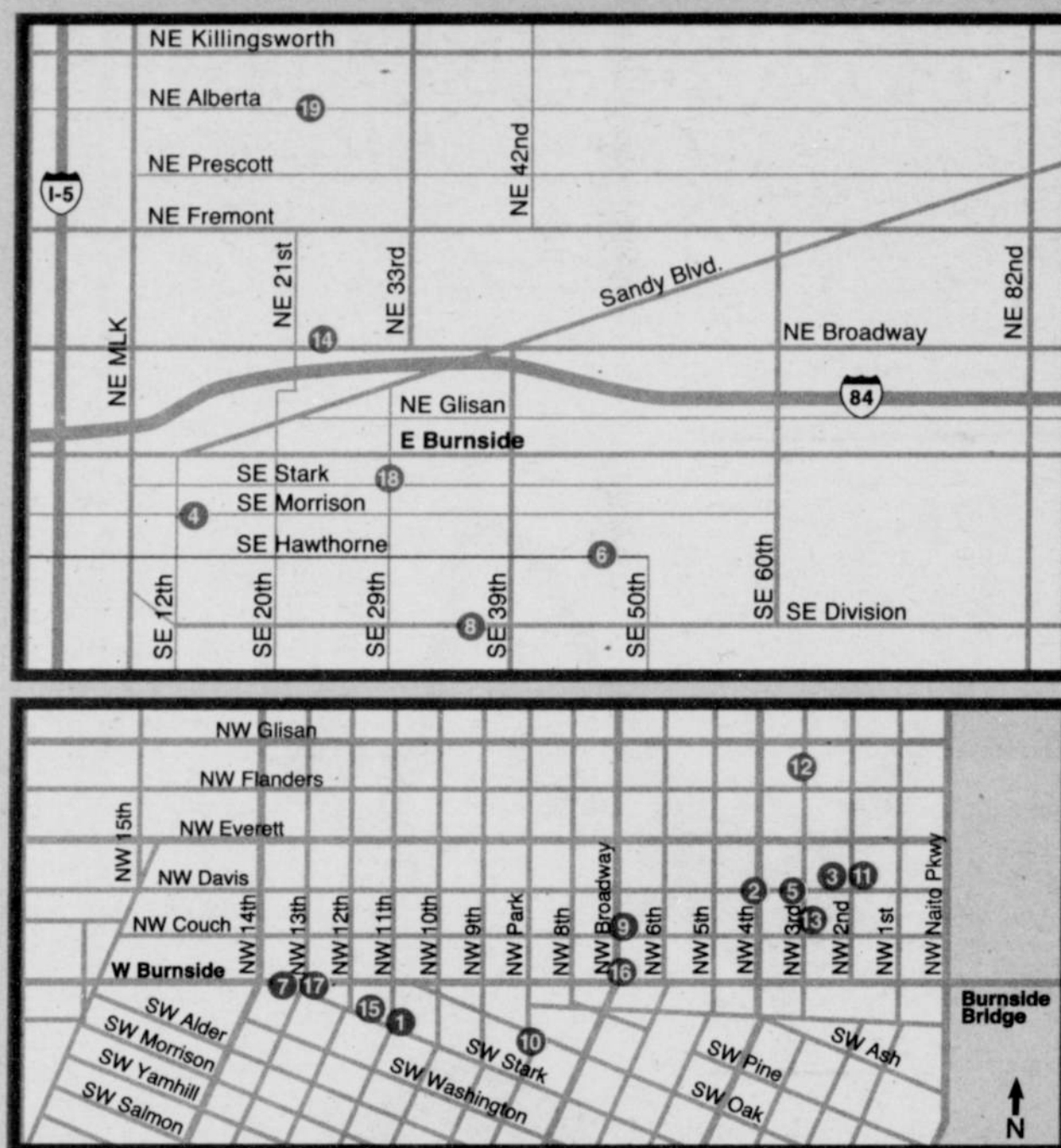
provided, along with cinnamon dolce lattes from Starbucks and a raffle featuring, among other prizes, dinner at the Red Star Tavern and a stay at Hotel Monaco.

Naturally, no Portland drag revue would be complete without glamour incarnate, the venerable Darcelle herself, who will preside as mistress of ceremonies. "When Darcelle asked Poison Waters to entertain at the third annual benefit, I fell in love with the Camp Starlight people, and that's how I became involved," says Cook. "I'm very grateful to her for that."

The event promises 90 minutes of glitzy, wisecracking comedy served up by a colorful cast of celebrity avatars, including special out-of-town guests John Bloss of Las Vegas, described by Cook as "a dead ringer for Reba McEntire," and Misty Stevens of Seattle, who pays homage to Patsy Cline. Also returning to Portland from Vegas will be Jayson Malone, invoking the divine Miss Bette Midler.

Divas & Desserts starts 7 p.m. at 208 N.W. Third Ave. Tickets are \$25 at the door or \$20 in advance from 503-223-5907, ext. 280.
