My inspirations are Thomas Pynchon and Wendy Carlos. She's a musician. She used to be Walter Carlos. She's a genius.

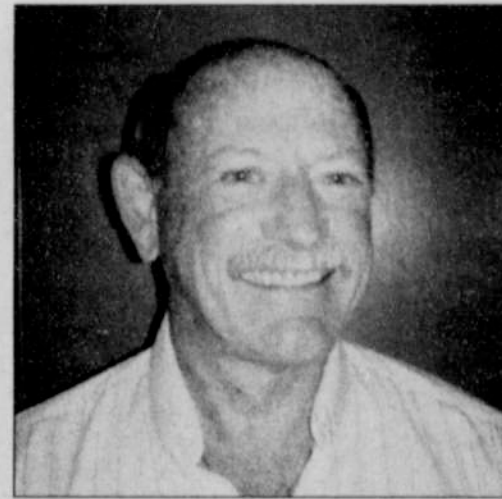
The last queer or philanthropic event I participated in was the Pickathon [Roots Music Festival].

With Silverado poised to leave its current home, is this the end of Portland's gay district as we know it?



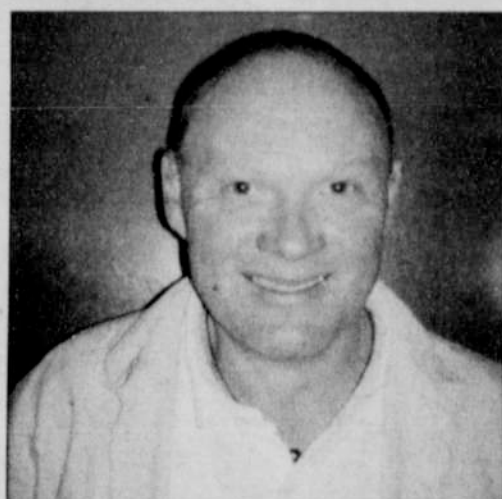


