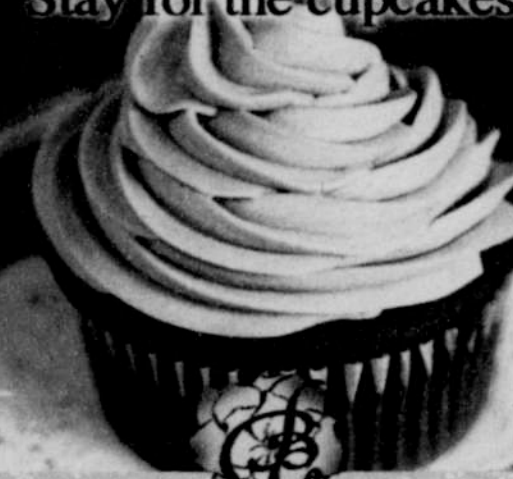

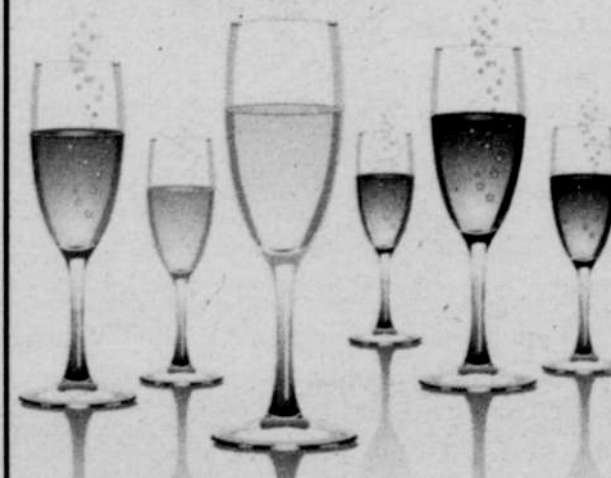

Lucky Devil Lounge

In the past four years, that locale has seen more turnover than a doughnut shop. The chic interior is fantastically smoke-free and trimmed with classy black booths (reminiscent of another joint venture, Sassy's), red velvet wallpaper and impressive exotic dancers. Feast your eyes on the extremely reasonable menu and order away. The food is good, bordering on great for strip club grub. A fully loaded half-pound burg will only set you back \$7, leaving you plenty of ones to spend on your other appetite. And for those who only take their flesh visually, there are some good vegetarian options as well. The house special, mac 'n' cheese, isn't the best in town but definitely hits the spot.

Utopia Café

Dine communally and rub elbows with some Southeast hotties, at a table over steaming Stumptown or right up in the action at the bar. No matter what, this one-room dining experience is a little piece of heaven.
