



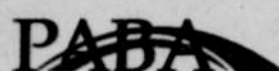

Vancouver Pride

Vancouver, Wash., marks its 14th Saturday in the Park celebration with a plethora of exciting events for those in the Southwest Washington area. This year's theme will be "Yellow Brick Road."

Activities are slated to last from noon to 6 p.m. July 12 at Esther Short Park, 610 Esther St.

This free, family-friendly event attracts up to 3,000 participants annually, thanks to its festive activities including live music, vendor/information booths, presentations, performances and fun.
