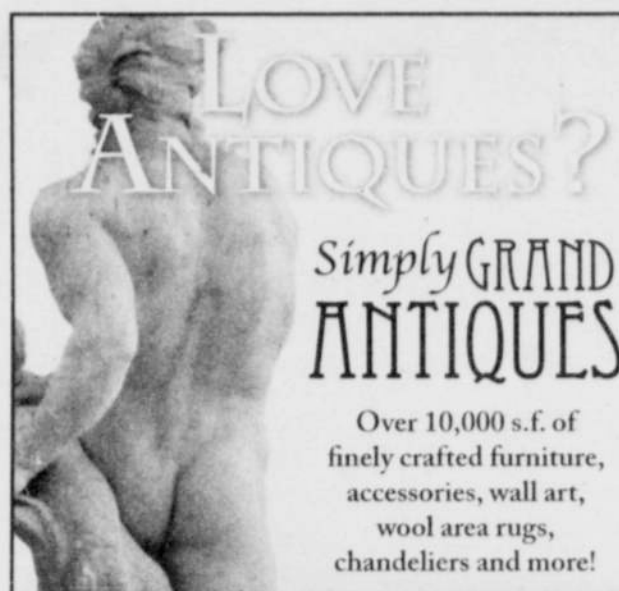

our issues are welcome to be discussed in this White House."

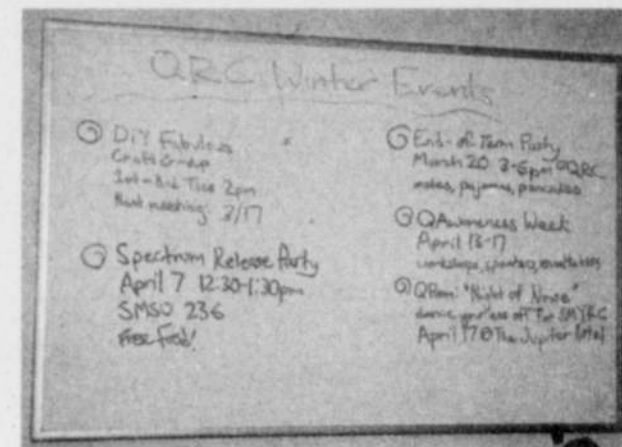

»More Kids Stuff

Equity Foundation and Pride Foundation are partnering to celebrate sexual minority youth and allies at the Second Annual QueerCore Youth Awards. This important event takes place from 2 to 4 p.m., Saturday April 4, at the new Q Center (4115 N. Mississippi Avenue). Honoring several queer youth and allies from Portland and Southwestern Washington, between the ages of 15 and 21, the recipients will be given their awards by leaders in the queer community including Q Center Executive Director Kendall Clawson, Basic Rights Oregon Director Jeana Frazzini and BRO Development Coordinator Juan Martinez, PFLAG Portland president Dawn Holt and Equity Foundation supporters Curtis Meyers, Frank Schreckenberger, and Susie Shepherd.

»College Publication To Offer Sexual Spectrum

Portland State University student Nathan Keep is launching a new paper next month that will focus on issues related to sex and gender. *The Spectrum* will be released at 12:30 p.m. April 7 at PSU's Smith Memorial Student Union (1825 SW Broadway, Room 236). "There has been some misconception about this paper being specifically queer themed," said Keep, who is gay. "Granted, this will cover topics within the queer community, but also addresses sex and gender equality, discrimination, oppression and advocacy within the community."

The quarterly paper, financially backed by the Queer Resource Center and the Student Organization Council, will be distributed at the start of each term in the Smith Memorial Student Union, Women's Resource Center and Queer Resource Center, plus several locations around town, including the Sexual Minority Resource Center and Q Center. The first issue is said to contain features about Mayor Sam Adams' sex scandal, personal coming-out stories within Portland and an article about harassment by employers for being gay.

According to Keep, *The Spectrum* is a necessary platform to address issues of sexual and gender oppression.

"The rationale behind *The Spectrum* was actually out of a much frustration with other campus publications not addressing these kinds of issues, at least not from the first person perspective," said Keep. "My involvement in other leadership roles on campus has allowed for a more holistic understanding that Portland State is still facing issues in terms of diversity and awareness of cultural differences. We have students that have come to us wanting to file complaints against faculty, professors and other students that have made [them] feel isolated and discriminated against." *The Spectrum* staff is seeking written and visual material for its Fall 2009 issue.
