# **Dead Letters Come to Life**

Fear No Music brings Elvis Costello's Juliet Letters to Aladdin

Somewhere between his long-hair-and-beard phase during 1991's plaintive pop gem Mighty Like a Rose and his full return to rock roots with The Attractions on 1994's Brutal Youth, Elvis Costello got in touch with his classical side. Long revered as a songsmith hell-bent on excavating the outer reaches of the music sphere to craft multicultural and multigenerational tunes, Costello collaborated with the Brodsky Quartet on 1993's The Juliet Letters, in what showcased his malleable musicianship to a whole new audience.

Fear No Music, Portland's 21st-century classic ensemble, is teaming up with some of the city's most talented performers for a one-night-only revisitation of Costello and the Brodsky Quartet's experimental epoch. Handling the song cycle of The Juliet Letters—a concept album of sorts, based on an imaginary correspondence between a Veronese academic who'd taken on the task of responding to letters addressed to Juliet Capulet—is up-and-coming local talent Leah Yorkston, multidisciplinary artist and folk hero Holcombe Waller, classically trained tenor Stephen Marc Beaudoin and mezzo-soprano Angela Niederloh.

Having developed a reputation as a bit of a chameleonic group themselves, Fear No Music's wide-ranging approach to uniting musicians and artists from different disciplines and media fits in flawlessly with the spirit of Costello's vision. Certain to be steeped in both resounding, dramatic movements of melancholy (see "Dear Sweet Filthy World") and slight insanity (see "Swine"), this production is likely the closest you'll come to seeing Costello live in Portland anytime soon.
