1955-2011

Kent Tikey Magionos of Lake Oswego, Ore. died Saturday, March 12 at the age of 55 as a result of liver cancer. He was born August 12, 1955 in Colorado Springs, Colo., the son of Tikey and Eugenia Magionos. He spent his early years living in Peru, Hawaii and Alaska before the family settled in Eagle Creek, Ore., where he then

graduated from Estacada High School and, soon after, attended Portland State University.

Magionos' natural talent and eye for design quickly earned him a respect among the interior design community, while his kindness and generosity drove his deep involvement in many of Portland's charitable organizations such as Boys and Girls Aid Society, Cascade AIDS Project, Key to the Cure, Our House and others.

"He never said 'no' to anyone who asked him to sit on a committee," said Jim Miley, a friend of 22 years.

Magionos was happiest spending time with his many endearing friends and family members who adored him for his big heart and ability to share his time and love unconditionally.

"[He was] giving to a fault, quick-witted, loving, never judged a soul, laughed with his whole heart and taught me the meaning of patience," said Stephanie Warden, a friend of 26 years. "He lived life with everything he had to bring to this world."

Magionos will be remembered by everyone he met for his kind heart, ability to give and impeccable style.

A memorial service was held March 26.

Kevin Anthony Hendrick
1971-2011

Kevin Anthony Hendrick, 39, a former resident of Portland, died March 24 at his home in Burlington, Vt. A man of tremendous warmth, gentleness, generosity of spirit and humor, Hendrick brought joy and love to others, and built for himself a life much the same. He also wrestled with demons stemming from a childhood and adolescence filled with severe abuse. Those demons resulted in episodic depression and substance abuse, which led to his death from a prescription drug overdose.

Despite the crippling effects of the abuse he suffered, Hendrick demonstrated extraordinary resilience and strength by forg-

ing a rich and full life. He established meaningful friendships; held positions in the accounting, health care and restaurant industries; played the piano; was fluent in French; volunteered for numerous community organizations; served his Buddhist temple in a variety of roles; built a family with his partner of 15 years; managed cross-country moves and made new homes when they relocated from Texas to Oregon and then Vermont;

lavished care on their two animal companions, Dionne and Tobias; and smiled and laughed throughout virtually every day. That Hendrick could do so much so well and so lovingly was a testament to his remarkable spirit, huge heart and innate beauty.

Services were held March 31 at Dharma Rain Zen Center in Portland. A memorial service will be held at 11 a.m. Saturday, April 2, at Laurel Heights United Methodist Church in San Antonio. Hendrick is survived by his partner, Thomas Bruner, and members of the Bruner, Hendrick and House families across the country.
