New OMSI exhibit explores gaming history, technology and culture

Gaymers and gnerds of the world unite! The Oregon Museum of Science and Industry will have fans jumping for joystick with **Game On 2.0**, what's being billed as the world's biggest video game celebration—and the exhibition's U.S. premiere.

A promised 125 playable games (including pinball!) are only the beginning. Attendees are invited to immerse themselves in a hands-on history of video game culture, from the very first commercial coin-operated machine to the latest in virtual reality, 3-D and thought-interface design. No Pac-Man pixel will remain ungnobbed, no controller or collectible untouched, throughout this 40-year retrospective, which chronicles the evolution of game design, development, production and marketing from the earliest computer titles through arcade-era icons and the present virtual realm.

Witness original concept and character art through their creators' eyes. Turn your ears to the vintage 8-, 16- and 32-bit sounds of Nintendo's Koji Kondo and World of Warcraft composer Jason Hayes. Learn about the social and community-development aspects of online, multiplayer gaming. Pay your respects to console legends Atari, Sega and Sony. Tour the global gaming universe in print, by genre and on the big screen, and step into the future—literally—with the national debut of Virtusphere, a 10-foot hollow sphere in which a user can run freely while wearing a wireless, head-mounted display. All together now: Whoa.

Whether your high scores are in Pong or Pokemon, Space Invaders or the Sims, Asteroids or Halo Reach, OMSI's exhibit is on like... *you know*. Couple that with the already-running Narnia, The Exhibition, on view through September 25, and you've a day made in Geek Heaven. True story.
