The **Gay and Lesbian Archives of the Pacific Northwest (GLAPN)** will present its first all-female Our Stories event at Q on Saturday, November 5, when it spotlights the history of women's softball. This special showcase of female athletes will feature the oral history of fast-pitch softball culture through the 1950s and '60s from the mouths of those who lived it.

Guest speakers include Louise "Chris" Mazzuca, an imposing hurler who threw nine perfect games and recorded an astounding 35 no-hitters during her tenure on the mound. Speaking on the impact of Title IX on women's sports before and after its implementation, Timi Elwood will also speak; and Donna Luckett will relate what softball has meant to her in her experiences involved with the Lesbian Community Project softball tournaments.

Doors for the Our Stories event are at 6:30 p.m., and the presentation begins at 7. Admission is free, though donations to Q Center are always encouraged.

In yet another unique local partnership, the **Oregon Museum of Science and Industry (OMSI)** will co-host a **Family Science Night** Monday, November 7 with a special welcome to LGBTQ families. Per a press release, OMSI exhibit developer Tim Hecox said OMSI is hoping to evolve this event into an annually

funded occurrence, in line with the museum's continued efforts to reach underserved audiences.

A suggested donation of \$5 per family is requested for admission. The Family Science Night runs from 6 to 8 p.m., and will include access to most of the museum, excluding the traveling exhibition of "Body Worlds," and a few of OMSI's science labs.

Heading into the **center's end-of-the-year giving campaign, a kickoff party** is scheduled for Friday, November 4 at Q from 7 to 10 p.m. Armed with the infectious dance beats of DJ Lunch Lady, the "Dream A Little Dream" event will include food and drinks to fuel your giving ways. A couple of weeks later, Q will host the **Shorty Shorts Queer Short Film Festival** with Gula Delgatto and Fannie Mae Darling. This annual cinematic adventure, slated

### Search For Missing Man Continues

A 30-year-old gay Portland man has been missing since July 7 and investigators are searching for any clues as to his whereabouts.

Clackamas County Sheriff's Office investigators say Steven Moline was traveling to the Bagby Hot Springs, about 70 miles southeast of downtown Portland in Mt. Hood National Forest. Moline was riding with friends, said sheriff's office spokesman Sgt. James Rhodes, when the driver of the

car pulled over because she suspected she had missed a turn and the car was low on gas.

According to accounts given to investigators, the friends wanted to return to Portland, but Moline said he wanted to continue to Bagby Hot Springs on foot, about a five-mile hike through the forest from that point. The driver of the car said she shouted for Moline to come back

to the car and honked the horn. She said she waited an hour before leaving and called 911 when she was able to receive cellular phone service near Estacada.

After two days without word from Moline to his family or friends, a search party was called to go through the Bagby Hot Springs area, but no one found him.

Moline has epilepsy as well as a history of depression, and he is prone to seizures. He is believed to be without his medication.

Investigators said they have heard conflicting accounts about the number of people riding in the car with Moline, and at least one person who rode in the car is not being fully cooperative with investigators presumably because of a DUI charge that calls for the person's arrest.

Moline's mother, Carol Degagne, is suspicious of the friends' accounts. She said Moline has been to Bagby Hot Springs sev-
