

United Way of the Columbia-Willamette community weren't already a big enough debate before Mars Hill arrived in Portland's Sunnyside neighborhood, it became the debate for local equality activists heading out of summer. When it was announced in early September that the evangelical mega-

church would be moving into Southeast Portland, the news was met with swift criticism by hardcore LGBTQ rights activists across the city. Before the congregation had even moved in, or its pastor Reverend Tim Smith offered an opportunity to address the skeptical denizens of its new community, Mars Hill was public enemy No. 1.

As reported by Just Out's Aaron Spencer in mid-September, the controversial aspects of Mars Hill's sermons were not unfounded, and polarizing even among conservative Christians. Its Seattle pastor, Mark Driscoll, has been criticized for comments he made about male pastors behaving too effeminately. The church also believes homosexuality is a sin, though so do several churches in Portland, even some in the Sunnyside neighborhood, where the Mars Hill branch is located. Mars Hill also raised eyebrows with a video posted on its website about the new Portland church, which shows im-


ages of rainbow flags and a strip club while Smith says, "[Portland] values sexual freedom as an end in itself with a thriving sex industry that goes back for more than a century."




