Y.M.C.A. YOUTH GOVERNMENT

The Young Men Christian's Association sponsors a Youth Legislative in Salem, Oregon every year. Each Hi-Y and Tri-Hi-Y club may select two of its members to be delegates, senators, or representatives, and two observers. They may also have one member elected to a state office.

There are three objectives to this program. The first is to enable Hi-Y and Tri-Hi-Y members to better understand the process of American democratic government. Another is to provide experience in developing use for constructive legislation. The third objective is to inform youth of the problems, privileges, obligations and responsibilities in the American democracy.

Every club works out a new bill or amendment which they feel would make a good state law. Zeta Tri-Hi-Y Bill states students that are in county juvenile homes should be given educational instruction.

The presented this bill at the district meeting, District three, which includes Roseburg, Ashland, and Klamath Falls, met Saturday February 17, at Southern Oregon College.
