Voth capped a 61 yard advance with a four yard jaunt around right end as Ashland scored first in the initial quarter.

Klamath took advantage of a short Ashland punt and made the only successful Pelican drive of the afternoon, as Scott dove over from the one yard line.

Ashland tallied again in the second quarter on a 53 yard drive topped by a 30 yard trot by Voth on a pitch from Boas Coldwell.

Voth plunged one-yard in the fourth quarter for Ashland's third touchdown which started on the 50 yard line after the two teams had gone scoreless during the third quarter.

Coach Lance Locke made special mention of performances by Terry Clark on both offense and defense and Wayne Cullop, who turned in a special defensive performance.
