### Seniors To Take College Boards

College Board tests will be given December 5 at Southern Oregon College to those students who have registered on time. Registration blanks must be in Berkeley, California, by November 7. These blanks may be obtained from Mrs. Zwick or Mr. Silver.

College Boards are required as part of the entrance application for all state colleges except SOG, and for most private colleges. Students planning to apply for Oregon State Scholarships are also required to take the tests on December 5.

Students taking the aptitude tests will be charged a \$4.50 fee. Fees for one, two, or three Achievement Tests are \$6.75. Students must pay the fees when they send the registration blank to Berkeley, California.
