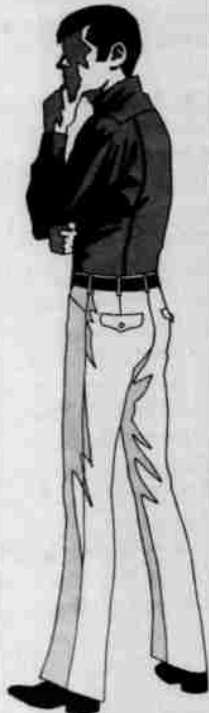
**Letterman's Club**
