This work is scheduled for April 6 through April 24, 2015. The City asks people to remove any decorative items, flowers, etc. prior to April 6, 2015. Please note that decorative items not removed from

graves and headstones by that date will be collected by the contractor beginning on that date. Collected items, other than perishable or deteriorated items, will be stored until claimed or until November 1, 2015.
