And, Sizer's own children, percussionist Dan attends Lewis and Clark College on a full ride scholarship, and flutist Kate studies at Whitman College also on a full ride scholarship.

"I've really been blessed with having this many great students. I've had a lot of valedictorians and salutatorians in my classes," said Sizer.

"I give thanks to the administration here—having Jerry Peacock and Mindi

Vaughan here all these years was a great support. And, thanks to the really strong elementary school music teachers. I also want to thank the Leo Adler Foundation and the Harold Kirkin Fund and the alumni who buy instruments through their donations. Also, the Community Concert Association has been very supportive and has hired the band to backup performers, and have had us on the concerts," said Sizer.

"The year we had the (Oregon) Symphony here

was a highlight of my career. Other highlights include the trips we take every year and the five or six times we've played at the state band festival," he added.

Like any great performer, Sizer leaves the Baker School District at the top of his game with his audience wanting more.

## Three arrested for meth
