He was very instrumental in managing the important transition from old-growth logging to the highly mechanized second-growth logging and he always considered a good working relationship with the labor unions was critical to a successful, highly efficient operation.

Jack retired from Weyerhaeuser in 1991, after 27 years with Weyerhaeuser; he was awarded the Weyerhaeuser President's Special Award for outstanding work five times while with the company. He joined the Society of America Foresters in 1951 and continued membership with them until his death.

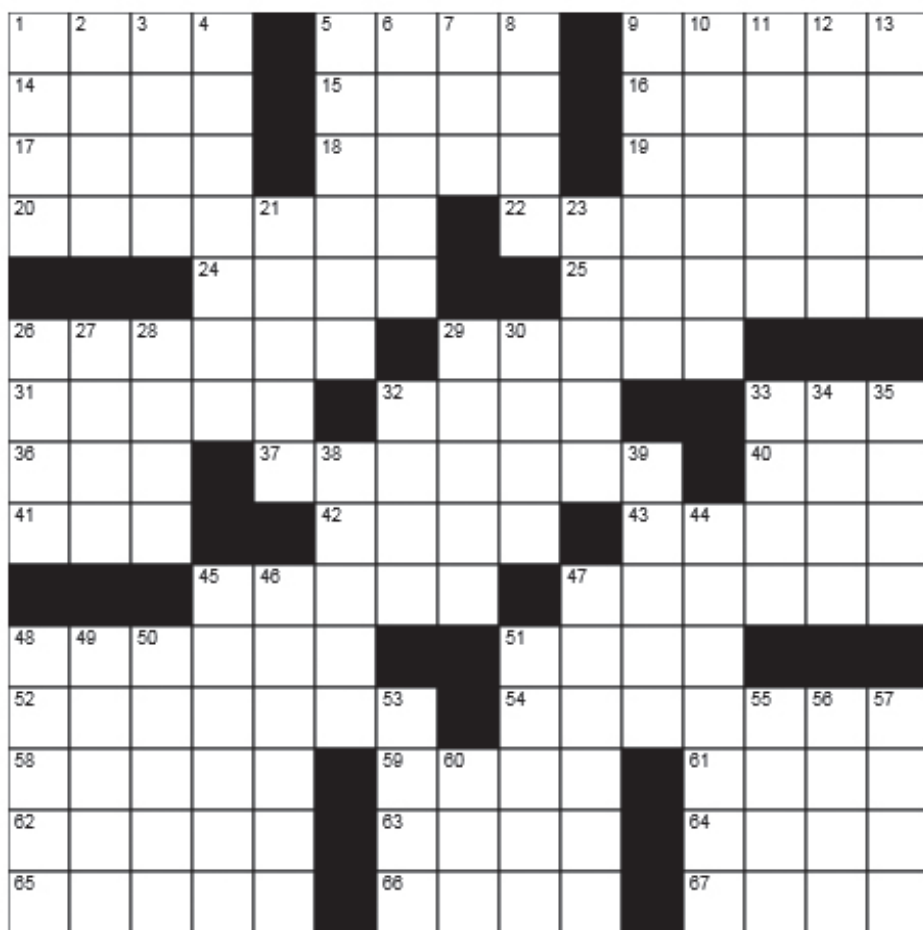

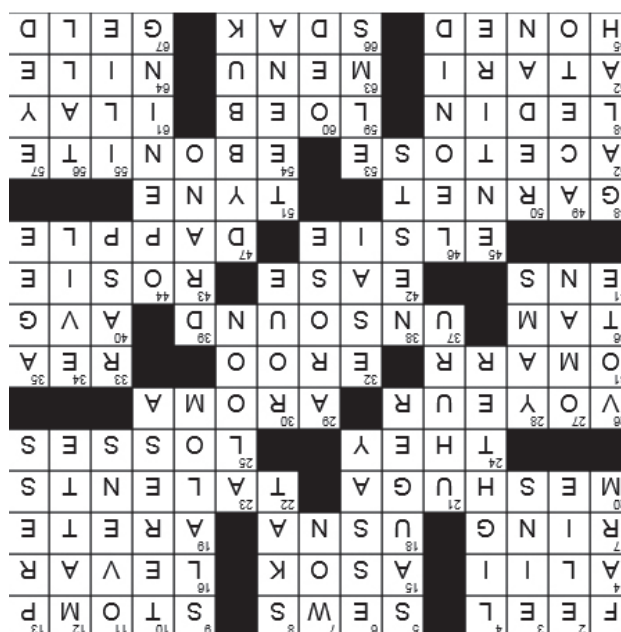
