## **State senate candidate Stormy Ray visits Huntington** detectors

State Senate candidate Stormy Ray, who is running as a democratic candidate for District 30, came to Huntington April 20th to fundraise for her campaign and to spread the message of her bid for office.

Ray is running against incumbent Republican Senator Ted Ferrioli, from John Day, the current State Senator for District 30.

Stormy Ray became known to most Oregonians while fighting for the legalization of medical marijuana in the State Capitol and to the citizens of Huntington when she spoke before the city council to encourage them to allow medical dispensaries.

# Free smoke

The Baker City Fire Department's free smoke detector giveaway began last fall, and since that time, says Fire Chief Mark John, the department has given away and installed somewhere between 250 and 300 of them. Assistant Chief Dan Curtis "has installed ninety-pluspercent of those, which is really remarkable for a department this size."

John plans to continue giving away and installing the detectors as long as they're able to keep getting a supply-they've so far been able to order bunches of 100 at a time from the State Fire Marshall's office.

"It just adds another measure of safety," said John. The smoke detectors aren't available for multi-family units like apartment complexes-single-family homes only. Home renters or owners can request an installation. One alarm in each bedroom and on each floor of a home is the recommendation.

As John pointed out, "People generally succumb to smoke inhalation." Far fewer die due to direct contact with flames during a fire.

Smoke alarms can be requested by calling 541-523-3711 on a first come, first served basis.
