"We're so happy to award EOU for developing skills relevant to graduates' lives," said Tyson Schritter, executive editor for Colleges of Distinction. "High student engagement in college is one of the keys to a successful

undergraduate education. With an increasing emphasis on hands-on learning techniques, Colleges of Distinction applauds EOU for practicing methodologies that prepare students for their futures."

The annual selection process also includes a review of each institution's freshman experience, general education program, strategic plan, and alumni success and satisfaction measures.

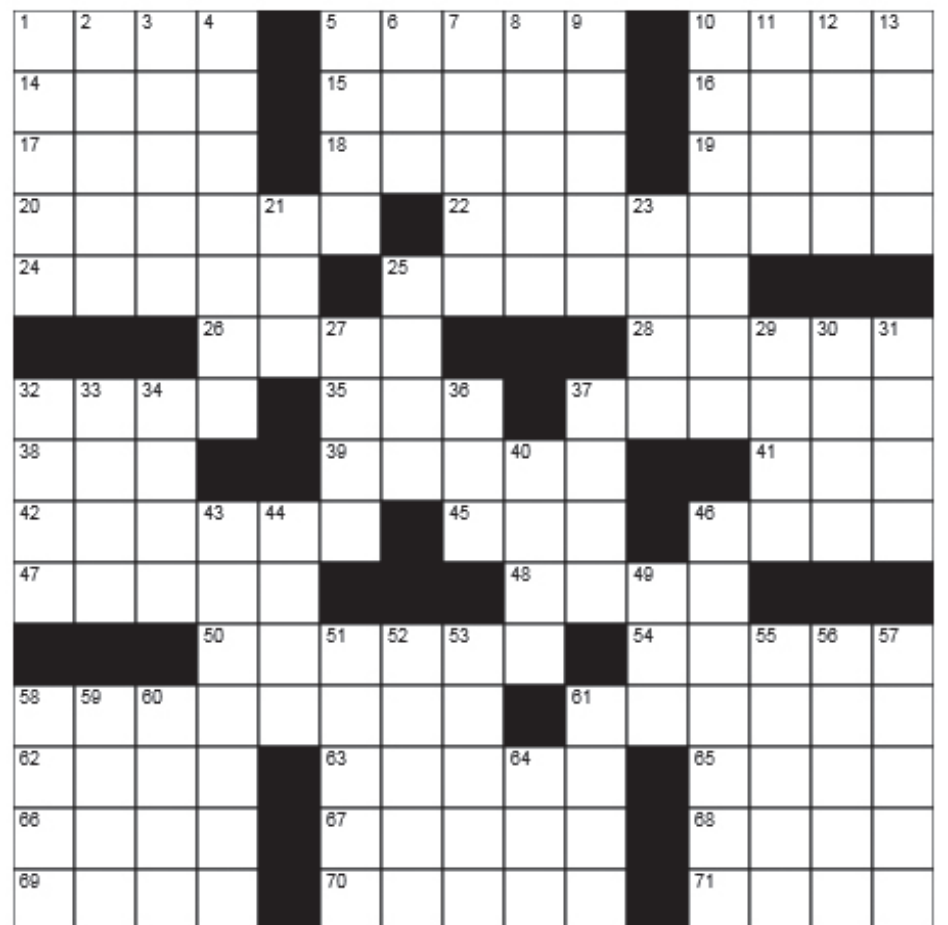
