## Law enforcement classes

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In the final week, Woodward will discuss parole and probation. Woodward explained that once they have arrested someone and, once they are convicted or agree to a sentence, they have to be under the supervision of parole and probation. They will discuss what that looks like, how long people are under supervision depending on the crime, and talk about the functions of a parole and probation officer. "In discussing all these aspects, we'll cover what it will take for a high school student to get into those specific branches of law enforcement," explained Woodward. "Maybe what kind of course work would be helpful to them. Do they need to go to college, yes or no. A lot of agencies, a lot of police departments, don't require a college education to be a police officer, but some do. So

what course work would be beneficial to them, not only at the high school level, but then also moving forward into college." They will also discuss practical things, such as pay scale, salary, what a typical shift would look like, day shifts, night shifts, swing shifts, and other such things. The courses will be March 3rd, March 10th, April 14th, and April 28th. These classes coincide with Blue Fridays at the school, days that are optional and students can choose to be involved in. "The end goal of this is to get kids, that are interested in law enforcement, also to participate further with the police department as cadets," explained Woodward. "And a police cadet program is, typically in most agencies you have full time officers and then you have reserve officers—those are volunteer officers—and usually you have to be 21 or older to be a reserve officer, so

you're not full-time, you're not paid full-time, you're mostly a volunteer. But then a lot of agencies also have cadets. And so, police cadets, that program is for those that are basically high school age that are interested in learning more about law enforcement. And so it gives them a way to apply to the police department, to be hired on as a cadet—again, it's a volunteer position—but kids get to volunteer hours at the police department, they get to go through an interview process, a background process." If they are accepted, students are able to volunteer with the police department a couple hours a month. The students could volunteer at parades and being on parade routes. They could also do crime prevention at local stores in uniform. They will have a different uniform than officers and will not be armed.

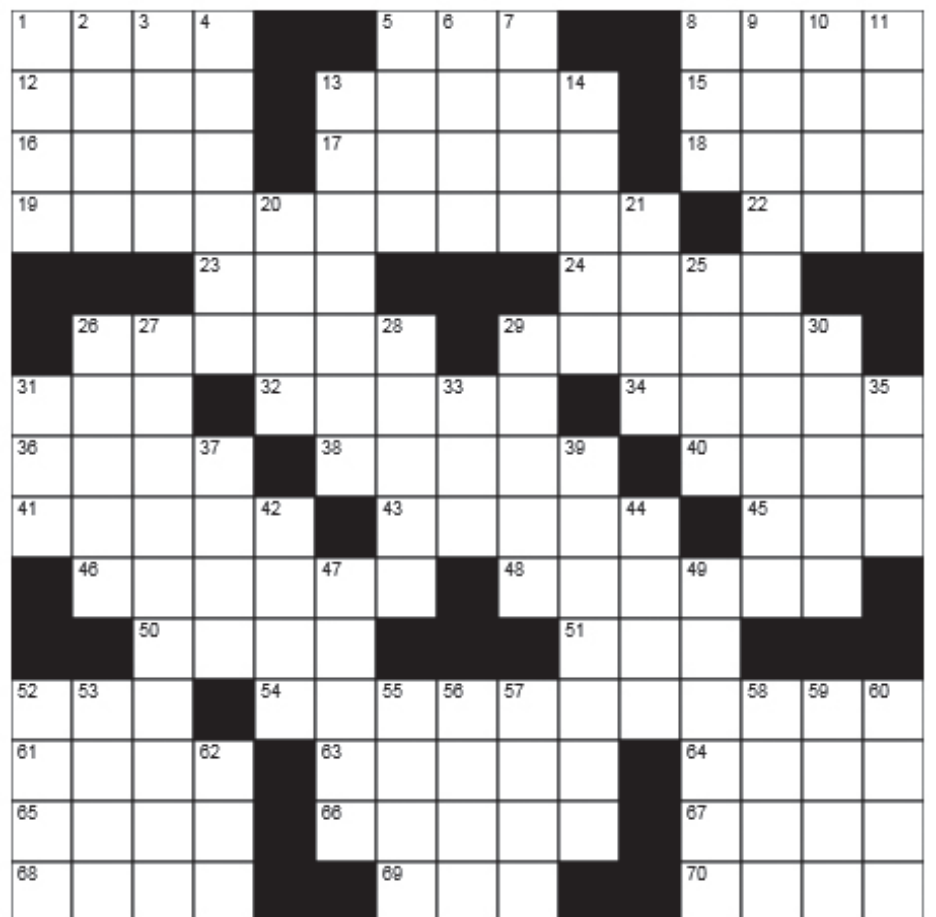

Find and circle all of the animals that are hidden in the grid. The remaining letters spell the name of an additional animal.

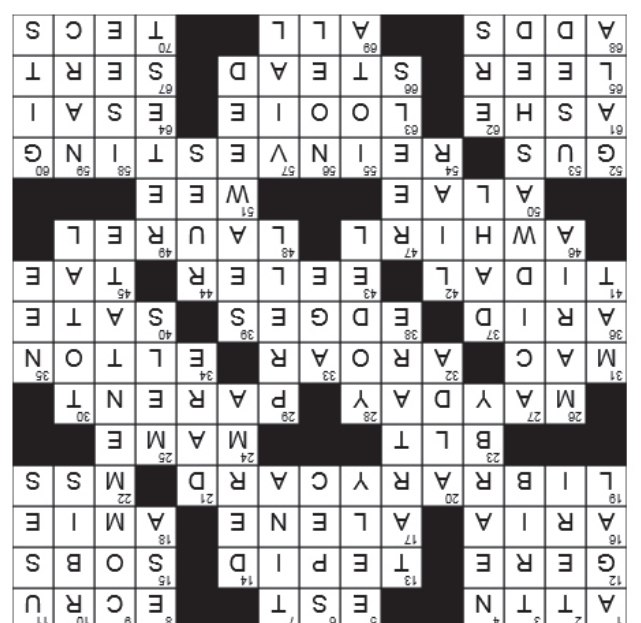
